The La Vista Daze theme this year is "The Great Outdoors".



Vision 84 update

Vision 84, La Vista's conceptual plan for redeveloping the 84th Street corridor, was approved by the City Council in 2010. City staff has been working hard to develop several elements of the implementation phase, including the following:

- **Design standards** - Work is currently underway on design standards that will help govern building design decisions and provide guidance to staff in reviewing proposed projects in the future. It is anticipated the design standards will be similar to those adopted for areas elsewhere in the City, such as Southport.

- **Blight/Substandard Study** - The City Council recently approved a blight/substandard study of the 84th Street corridor, which will determine whether Tax Increment Financing would be a viable tool when recruiting developers and evaluating projects for this area.

- **Master Park Plan** - Vision 84 calls for the existing La Vista Falls Golf Course to be transformed into a regional park. The first step in that process is to create a master park plan for the area. It is anticipated this process, which will involve extensive input from the public, will get started

later this year. Watch the City's Web site and the next issue of CityWise for more information.



"Redeveloping our 84th Street corridor continues to be, our top priority at the City," said Mayor Douglas Kindig. "Developing the vision was important, but that was just the first step in a much longer process. While at times it may appear that nothing is happening along the corridor, I want to assure all La Vista residents that we will be working on this vision until it becomes reality."

Suburban Battle of the Badges

This May fire/rescue and law enforcement agencies from La Vista, Papillion, Bellevue, Gretna, Springfield, Ralston and the Sarpy County Sheriffs Office will host the first ever Suburban Battle of the Badges.

In addition to celebrating local first responders, this special event will help ensure the American Red Cross can meet the needs of patients over the summer months, because the need for blood is constant.

During this friendly competition, area first responders will recruit blood donors from their ranks, families, neighborhoods and the community at large. The competition will be based on points where all points will be combined to determine whether fire/rescue or law enforcement had more presenting donors. All participating departments on the winning side will receive a trophy and bragging rights for the year.

La Vista Daze to Feature Several Community Events

Kids, teens, adults and families - there will be several good reasons for you to visit La Vista Daze this year.

The festival officially begins Wednesday night, May 25, at 7 p.m. at La Vista Junior High with the annual La Vista Daze Prayer Walk, sponsored by the La Vista churches. The prayer walk route goes up Edgewood Boulevard to Giles Road, west to 84th Street, north to Park View Boulevard and ends at City Hall with stops along the way.

The carnival will open on Thursday, May 26, at 5 p.m. in Central Park. Thomas Amusements will be back again this year. Rides will open again on Friday at 2 p.m., just in time for the last day of school, and will close for the night at 11 p.m. The carnival's schedule is: Saturday, May 28, 10 a.m.-11 p.m. and Sunday, May 29, noon-6 p.m.

The **La Vista Daze parade**, sponsored by **Bank of Nebraska**, will once again begin at 1 p.m. at 87th & Park View Boulevard. It will then continue along Park View, crossing 84th Street to Edgewood Boulevard, where it will turn right and end just past the entrance to Central Park.

The viewing stand will be located at the walk-in entrance to Central Park off of Park View Boulevard, also known as Flag Pole Park. Prizes will be given to entries in four categories based on float, best theme, best musical performance and best marching band.

In addition to the usual traditions - carnival rides, food and the parade - La Vista's annual festival will feature several other events, some of which were new last year. Events are free for participants as well as those attending.

Get to know: Stacy Corbit, Code Enforcement Officer

As a six-year employee of the La Vista Police Department's Records Division, Stacy Corbit is well-known among City employees.

Since being named La Vista's Code Enforcement Officer when that function moved to the Police Department, Corbit has had the opportunity to work directly with the community.

With nearly a year under her belt now, Corbit says she has enjoyed helping educate the public about the City's various codes and how those codes affect every La Vista resident.

"I have enjoyed the opportunity to work with the officers in a different capacity," she says. "My job is not only to enforce the city codes for general compliance by having contact with property owners and businesses, but also making them aware of the city codes so that we all have a safe place to live, work and play."

One of the main reasons the Code Enforcement function was moved to the Police Department was to provide greater flexibility to make contact with residents and property owners when it is convenient for them. Corbit is not tied to a normal 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. schedule and this flexibility has proven to be helpful in attaining code compliance while also building rapport with residents and property owners.

SPRING MAINTENANCE TIPS

Likely you've been working in your yard at least once already this spring, sprucing up your landscaping and making decisions about improvements for the year.

In addition to yard work, spring also is a time to perform maintenance on your home, which has been exposed to bitter temperatures and moisture during the winter months.

Here are a few maintenance tips that will help you keep your home in top condition:

Exterior Surfaces of a home should be inspected for the condition of the material (wood rot or moisture penetration). Damaged paint and caulking should be repaired or replaced. Exterior joints around windows and doors should be caulked, which helps keep your house weather-tight and lowers your heating and cooling bills.

Check for damage to your roof. Winter's snow, ice, and wind can wreak havoc on your roof. Inspect it for missing or broken shingles - using a pair of binoculars will keep you off a ladder! As the shingles age, the fine grains of stone get washed and worn off the surface, so after 15 or 20

years, even the best shingles may need to be replaced.

TRASH SURVEY UPDATE

The November 2010 CityWise newsletter asked La Vista residents their opinion of current trash hauling and recycling services. The survey responses indicate residents are very satisfied with the trash hauling and recycling services they are receiving and with the companies that are providing those services. Additionally, it is clear that residents value high quality services and that a reduction in service level would not be acceptable. The ultimate conclusion was that there is not significant support for making changes to the way the City provides trash hauling and recycling services.

FREE MULCH

Free mulch is available to residents almost anytime during the year. Residents are required to load the mulch by themselves. In addition, residents can drop off clean fill dirt or pick up small quantities of dirt,

REVIEW OF CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR 2011

The City of La Vista will again have a very active construction season in 2011. The following are the major projects to be undertaken by Public Works crews in the coming months.

Expansion of Golf Course Maintenance Building

Will allow all golf course maintenance equipment to be stored indoors and free up some much needed space for equipment maintenance.

Applewood Creek Drainageway Project

This project is located just north of Giles Road between 101st and 102nd Streets. Stream bank stabilization and erosion control measures will be put in place.

La Vista Link to the Keystone Trail Project

Installation of a trail from the southwest corner of the Sports

Complex (69th Street dead-end) to the southeast corner of 66th and Harrison streets.

Sports Complex Lighting Rehab

This project replaces the 20-plus year-old ball field lights at the complex with new energy efficient units.

132nd and West Giles Road

Design work is underway for improvements to the intersection.

Quiet Zone at Southport West

Railroad signal upgrades and road reconfiguration will eliminate the need for a train to blow its whistle when crossing West Giles Road.

96th Street - Giles to Harrison

This project includes removal and replacement of various concrete panels, repair to island medians and the reconstruction of the bridge approach slabs on 96th Street.

Demolition of Houses Along Thompson Creek Proceeding

The Thompson Creek Hazard Mitigation project has reached the demolition phase. Currently, 21 of the 24 homes in the program have been purchased and the other three are in various stages of the acquisition process. Demolition work began the last week of February and the second phase began in early April. This phase of the project is on schedule for completion by early 2012. Future work includes stabilization of the creek banks and stream channel. Finally, a linear park is envisioned to be installed along Park View Boulevard from 72nd Street to Edgewood Boulevard.
