## Brentwood Crossing to be Transformed into City Centre

The vision for a redeveloped 84th Street corridor is much closer to reality after a local developer announced plans to redevelop the Brentwood Crossing property into a vibrant, mixed use city center that will transform the heart of La Vista.

Omaha-based City Ventures has a contract to purchase the property, which includes the former Wal-Mart, and that sale is expected to close within the next several months.

As proposed, the old Wal-Mart and most of the other buildings and related improvements on the site will be cleared.

City Ventures is proposing to build City Centre, which will include approximately 350 apartments, 100,000 square feet of office space lofted above more than 200,000 square feet of neighborhood retail, dining and entertainment space.

The City is separately considering constructing public improvements in the redevelopment area to ensure, among other things, public safety, sufficient public streets, public off-street parking and uncongested traffic flows along City streets and in and around the redevelopment areas.

Additionally, the City will be taking the initial steps to begin transforming La Vista Falls Golf Course into a central recreational area and centerpiece of the City's 84th Street redevelopment area. In order to move forward with this transformation, the golf course will close at the end of the fiscal year, September 30.

Transformation of the golf course will create a focal point and *(continued page 3)*

### Steps Taken, Coming Next

Since the announcement this spring, City Ventures has been working with City staff on various planning documents, plats, and agreements. Amendments to the 84th Street Redevelopment Plan and Comprehensive Plan also are in process.

Following the closing on the land, demolition and site preparation will be scheduled. Construction will begin in 2017.

I have wanted to write this column for a long time! It appears our vision for 84th Street – specifically for the vacant Wal-Mart property – is about to become reality.

On the cover of this newsletter we’ve highlighted a proposed redevelopment project for the area, called City Centre, as well as the transformation of the golf course into a central recreational area with expanded lake and walking trails.

It has taken many years, and the dedicated work of staff and others, but we couldn’t be happier with the way our vision has been translated into plans for City Centre, which will create the downtown district our community has never experienced.

When the developer approached us, he did so because we had communicated our vision and we had the tools in place to translate that vision into reality.

The projects have been moving through the approval processes in the past few months. The years of planning and preparation are coming to fruition.

The development of a central recreational area means the closure of our golf course, which I know was controversial. Plans for the golf course are crucial to our vision for the area.

We have worked hard to listen to your desires for 84th Street and I feel confident that City Centre and transformation of the golf course will be centerpieces of our community, and we can all be proud when they are complete.

And speaking of listening to our citizens, the National Citizen Survey is coming up (see story on page 3). This will be the third time La Vista has participated in this survey to ask for feedback about City services. It is a great opportunity to offer your input about how the City is performing in a variety of areas. If you are selected to participate, please take the time to do so.

## Mayor's Youth Council

The La Vista Mayor's Youth Leadership Council is now accepting applications. The program is entering its second year and is designed to encourage middle and high school students to become active in the community by participating in local government.

Youth members on the Council will attend City Council meetings, and board and commission meetings where they will get to see the community decision-making process in action and offer a youth perspective on local government issues. They will also participate in community events, hopefully fostering a sense of civic participation and volunteerism.

In addition to interaction with Mayor Kindig and other elected officials, the Youth Leadership Council will be led by Police Officers Jamie Brown and Nick Jeanette, offering students an opportunity to create relationships with law enforcement officers and other City staff.

### To qualify, teens must:

1. Be a resident of the City of La Vista attending a public or private junior high or high school or a home school.
2. Be entering the 7th-12th grade.
3. Maintain good citizenship.
4. Demonstrate community interest and a willingness to serve the youth and community of La Vista.

### To remain on the council, members must:

1. Attend a minimum of 50 percent of all committee meetings and Youth Council meetings.
2. Fulfill other responsibilities as defined.
3. Set a good example for the youth of the community.
4. Complete annual orientation program conducted by city staff.
5. Attend one City Council meeting per quarter.
6. Attend scheduled meetings (held every other month).

## Shaping the Future of La Vista

Residents will soon be asked to participate in the National Citizen Survey which will allow the City to gather information about priorities; identify what the City is doing well and what services the city needs to improve upon.



Gathering your feedback will help staff explore ways to improve services and programs by making them more effective, relevant and easy to access. In addition, several data points from the survey, such as satisfaction rates will be used to develop performance measures for various services.

In August 1,500 randomly selected La Vista residents will receive a postcard letting them know that they have been selected to participate. A copy of the Citizen Survey will be delivered approximately one week later.

"The Citizen Survey is essentially a report card for City government," said Mayor Douglas Kindig. "As City leaders we always want to know where we can improve so it is imperative that we clearly understand the issues on the minds of our residents."

Residents who received this survey by mail are urged to take just a few moments and provide their perspective. Results of the survey will be reported in a future issue of CityWise and will be available on the City's website.

significant new amenity for public events and foster a sense of community and engagement for residents. The area will contain a large lake, a new trail system and an amphitheater with significant public space for special events and other gatherings.

The estimated cost of City public improvements, which would take place over multiple years, is \$54 million. Funds potentially will come from several sources, including but not limited to the half-cent additional sales and use tax approved by voters in May 2014.

# Salute to Summer Festival a Resounding Success



Summer kicked off in grand fashion Memorial Day weekend with the City's annual celebration, the Salute to Summer Festival.

The second annual Hometown Heroes Event was held on Thursday evening at City Hall, where new flagpoles for the service flags and POW/MIA flag were dedicated. Due to inclement weather the event had to be moved indoors. Dignitaries, veterans and families attended this event, which was designed to honor those who have served our nation in the military and those who have given the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom.

Thousands of people enjoyed the Community Cookout on Friday evening, sponsored by the La Vista Community Foundation, and the fireworks display, provided by Bellino Fireworks. Central Park was filled all weekend with people who took in the carnival and vendors.

This year's parade grand marshal was the family of U.S. Marine Lance Corporal Shane Kielion, who was killed in action in Iraq in 2004. Shane and his wife, April, were La Vista residents when he enlisted in the Marine Corps. Shane's parents, Pat and Roger, and his son, Shane Jr., represented the family.

Mary Kay Bellino, the longtime co-owner of La Vista Keno, was named Friend of La Vista. Mary Kay and her late husband Rich owned and operated La Vista Keno for many years and recently sold the business following Rich's tragic passing last summer. Mary Kay and Rich have been active supporters of numerous community organizations and could always be counted on for their generosity and support. Mayor Kindig presented a special award to Mary Kay at the Mayor's Lunch prior to the parade.

## Used Tire Collection

The City will be hosting a used tire collection event the week of August 22-27. Used tires can be dropped off at the Public Works Facility located at 9900 Portal Road.

Drop-off times are August 22-26, 7:30 a.m. - 3 p.m., and August 27, 8 a.m. - 3 p.m.

This project is made possible by a grant received from the Sarpy/Cass Health Department for West Nile Virus Prevention. Used tires left outside collect water and become prime breeding sites for mosquitoes. The used tires are collected and then sent to a recycling company for shredding.

In addition to used tires, used motor oil, anti-freeze and any type of batteries will be accepted. The event is open to all residents and those living in the City's Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction. Proof of residency will be required such as a photo ID or utility bill.

## Fall Leaf Collection

The City's annual fall leaf collection will take place Saturday, November 5, 8 a.m. - 3 p.m. at the Public Works Facility, 9900 Portal Road. The service is available to residents and those living in the City's Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction.

In addition, a dumpster will be available for yard waste disposal Monday through Friday, October 11 - November 4, 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Public Works Facility.

Leaves and grass clippings will be accepted along with tree branches, which can be any length but no larger than 6 inches in diameter. Used motor oil, anti-freeze and all batteries will also be accepted. Proof of residency will be required such as a photo ID or utility bill.

## Residential Sewer Drain Cleaning

When you have your home sewer line cleaned, notify the Public Works Department at 402-331-8927.

Material removed from your sewer line is forced into the main sewer line, which creates the possibility of it becoming stuck in the main and causing backup problems. When you notify Public Works, staff will check the main sewer line to ensure proper flow.

## Emerald Ash Borer Detected in Nebraska

The Emerald Ash Borer has been detected in several places in the Omaha metro area, which means you may have heard from a company wanting to help treat any ash trees you have on your property.

Not all companies offering treatment services are legitimate. Some warning signs a company may be trying to scam customers include:

- They are uninsured
- They are unlicensed
- They request payment up front.

The best way to combat these scams is to have a plan regarding treatment or removal of ash trees from your property and to begin to budget for these possibilities.

To help prevent the spread of the pest:

- Use locally sourced firewood, burning it in the same county where you purchased it.
- Only high value ash trees within 15 miles of a known infestation should be considered for treatment. Trees that are experiencing declining health should be considered for removal.
- If you feel you have located an Emerald Ash Borer infestation, report it to the Nebraska Department of Agriculture, 402-471-2351; the Nebraska Forest Service, 402-472-2944; or the local U.S. Department of Agriculture office, 402-434-2345.
