

Parade Fact Sheet

Saturday, May 25 Parade begins at 1 p.m.

Awards:

Participants in the Salute to Summer Festival 2019 Parade will be eligible for one of the following prizes:

- ✓ Best Float
- ✓ Best Marching Band
- ✓ Best Performance (music or dance)
- ✓ Best Theme

All award winners will be notified the week after the festival and will be required to provide their tax ID number.

Please read carefully:

NOTE: The parade will end at Park View Boulevard and 75th Avenue. Groups needing to unload passengers can do so on either Terry Drive or 73rd Avenue and all other entries can exit on 72nd Street.

- 1. All participants must be uniformed, if applicable, and appropriately dressed.
- 2. All entries will have a positive theme and will respect all audiences.
- 3. Any disregard of regulations could result in cancellation of entry.
- 4. Please carry a banner to help identify each group along the parade route and display the entry number provided by the City.
- 5. Your group must check in with the parade coordinator at 95th Street and Park View Boulevard.
- 6. Walking groups should check-in at 89th Street and Granville Parkway.
- 7. All groups must be in formation in the staging area no later than 12:45 p.m. Staging begins at 11 a.m.
- 8. At no time are entrants allowed to throw anything from the parade route, but they can walk along the curbs and hand out items.
- 9. Entries featuring animals must clean up droppings from the parade route immediately behind themselves.
- 10. No dogs will be allowed to walk in the parade. If you are planning to include dogs in your parade entry, we ask that these animals ride in a vehicle along the parade route.
