

City of La Vista
Park & Recreation Advisory Committee Minutes
November 16, 2022

A meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee for the City of LaVista convened in open and public session at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 16, 2022. Present was Recreation Director Scott Stopak, Asst. Recreation Director David Karlson, Youth and Adult Sports Manager Denny Dinan, Senior Services Manager Kaily Stanley, Community Events Manager Brian Allen, Chairperson Pat Lodes, Members Jeff Kupfer, Brenda Mechels-Stuby, Parks Foreman Rob George and Assistant City Planner Cale Brodersen.

Fall '22 Programming Highlights

Howl-O-Ween: For the new event debut, we had over 150-people (and their dogs in costumes) attending the event on Thursday, October 20 from 4:30 PM – 6:30p.m. at the La Vista Dog Park. Public Works built custom Halloween themed backdrops for photo opportunities provided by the Communications team. They later uploaded the pictures to our social media channels. Additionally, we handed out La Vista SWAG items, baked dog treats, and provided free hot drinks and smoothies from a local beverage service.

Halloween Safe Night: After a 2-years hiatus from being indoors, we celebrated Halloween on Monday, October 31 from 5:00 PM – 6:30 PM with over 900-people trick or treating indoors at the community center with 24-booths representing businesses from the local community and City departments. After trick or treating, the public was treated to free Hot Dogs that were sponsored by the La Vista Community Foundation, Five Points Bank, La Vista Keno, FNBO, and Weitz. Outdoors, families had Halloween themed backdrops for photo opportunities, free hot cocoa from the Police Department and hayrack rides with the Parks department.

Winter '22 Upcoming Dates

For the first time in three years, the traditional holiday programs are back just as you remembered them! The sleigh ride, led by Public Works and PD, will travel throughout the city on the Sunday after Thanksgiving. Tree Lighting will occur on the next night outside City Hall followed by a soup supper and entertainment from Elvis in the Community Center gymnasium. Santa and his Reindeer will also be there on Monday night, located down the road at Santa's Workshop.

Some new programming and logistical elements this year on Monday night include a live stream of the Tree Lighting event and theatrical lighting of the sidewalk along Park View Blvd. from the Tree Lighting area to Santa's Workshop meant to help with the safety and experience of all visitors. And back by popular demand is Santa Paws, a day that dog owners can bring their pups to take pictures with Santa.

This year the soup is being catered (and sponsored) by Hy-Vee and there will be two choices of either chili or chicken noodle. Currently, internal city staff and community volunteers have filled the necessary volunteer spots to help execute the 5-events at Santa's Workshop, but there are always additional opportunities to help volunteer as well. YOUTH AND ADULT SPORTS

Pre-School Playtime:

September totals: Adults = 69 Children = 82 Total=151 Avg = 17

October totals: Adults = 48; Children = 62; Total = 130 Avg = 16

Starting in September and on Every second Thursday of the month a staff member from the library will be conducting a craft, story time, other activity for the kids during the 1st hour of pre-school playtime.

Current Programs

All outdoor youth and adult sports finished play in October. All La Vista fields are now closed until April 2023.

Youth Volleyball: Practices started on October 11. Games started on Saturday Nov 5. We have 28 kids signed up with 1 - 3rd/4th grade team, 1 - 5th/6th grade team and 1 7th/8th grade team.

We will partner with the BJSA (Bellevue Junior Sports Association) again this year and games are held at their facility by Bellevue East High School.

Adult Women's Fall Volleyball has played 8 games of a 12 game schedule.

Upcoming Programs:

Youth Basketball League: Registration will continue until November 28. Practices will start Jan 2 and games will begin January 21. We are going to partner with the Sarpy Community Y for basketball again this year.

Youth Basketball Clinic: Registration will continue until December 28, and the clinic will start on January 14 and will run for 5 weeks.
