La Vista has never had its own downtown, and I look forward to seeing more events like this in City Centre and Central Park in the future that will bring our community together.



Get ready for fall family fun in the new downtown heart of La Vista!

Join us at Fall Fest this October to celebrate the opening of the City Centre development that includes new public pavilion areas, a music venue, restaurants and more.

Main Street will be closed to traffic to make room for a beer garden, yard games, local food and fall-themed activities for all ages.

Fun continues into the evening with fire pits and a movie in the outdoor amphitheater. We'll be showing *Guardians of the Galaxy 3* on the big screen and serving up

free popcorn while supplies last. Additional food and drinks will be sold at concessions.

Bring your own blankets and chairs for the movie. Food and beverages available for purchase at concessions. No outside food/beverages allowed.

Opening day nears for City Centre venues.

The next few months will be eventful as some of La Vista's newest attractions—The Astro, The Astro Amphitheater and The Link—open to the public. Both residents and visitors to La Vista will see several "firsts" around City Centre and Central Park this fall, including the first large-scale outdoor and indoor concerts.



If you live or work near these new developments or plan to visit for a concert or other event, here are some things to expect...

Vehicle and pedestrian traffic will be heavier during events.

Part of the vision behind City Centre was to create a gathering point

for people in La Vista. The City has never had a true downtown. Now we have a central gathering area complete with a first-class entertainment venue that has a capacity of 5,000 people for outdoor shows and 2,500 for indoor events.

It's exciting to know that people from all over will be gathering here. Of course, that means traffic will increase in the area before, during and after shows. Residents and event attendees should be aware of vehicle and pedestrian traffic, use extra caution and follow safety instructions. Signage will be in place to help direct traffic, and City staff will closely monitor needs and make ongoing improvements to help with traffic flow.

Concert music and sounds will fill the air.

Several outdoor concerts are booked in the amphitheater between the end of August and the early part of October.

Between 10 and 15 outdoor concerts are expected to be held in the amphitheater each year.

Factors such as the size of a concert and even the weather can impact the level of noise emitted during shows. The City adopted an ordinance to manage the sounds from shows and prevent concert noise from overwhelming residents. **The City's ordinance states that no outdoor amplified sound is permitted after 10 p.m. Sunday through Thursday, or after 10:30 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays.**

Additionally, Central Park and Central Park East have a 12 a.m. curfew. Extra security staff will be in place during events to enforce the curfew and help keep these areas free from noise overnight.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE + FIRE SAFETY TIPS

Fire Safety Month is celebrated each year in October. The Papillion Fire Department (which serves the City of La Vista) has some fun activities planned in observance, including an open house to kick off Fire Prevention Week.

The Fire Department will host an open house in La Vista, offering members of the community a chance to meet the department's new fire chief, tour the station, chat with local firefighters, climb inside vehicles and enjoy a snack. For more information, call **402.339.8617**.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS

The Fire Department shared these important safety tips for families from the National Fire Protection Association:

- Know at least two ways out of every room in your home, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows open easily.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Make sure your smoke and CO alarms meet the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Replace all smoke alarms after 10 years.
- A continuous set of three loud beeps—beep, beep, beep—means smoke or fire. Get out, call 9-1-1, and stay out.

Get to know the new Fire Chief, Robb Gottsch.



The Papillion Fire Department, which serves La Vista, hired a new fire chief this year. Rob Gottsch has been settling into the role after taking over for retiring chief Bill Bowes. Gottsch himself recently retired from the Omaha Fire Department before accepting his new position in Papillion.

Gottsch explained that it was his father, also a firefighter, who first encouraged him to consider a career in fire services. When Gottsch was enrolled in college in Lincoln after returning from active duty in the U.S. Navy, his father approached him saying "Why don't you come up and take the fire test for Omaha?"

"So I did, and I did extremely well," said Gottsch.

That opened the door to a 30-year career with the Omaha Fire Department. During his three decades with that department, Gottsch gained extensive knowledge across different areas of fire service while serving in positions from Captain to Fire Investigator to Battalion Chief.

"I feel very fortunate to be where I'm at today," Gottsch said. "All those years of experience, along with getting my education—I have my master's degree in public administration—really prepared me for this."

Gottsch said his role as Papillion's Fire Chief comes with a responsibility to make sure good things happen when people need help from the fire department.

"I'm here to ensure the resources (the people that work here at Papillion Fire Department) have the tools and technology to create good outcomes," Gottsch said.

Gottsch intends to ask questions like "Can we get better at what we do?" and "What resources and technologies do we need?" "The fire service is always in a state of transition," he said.

Gottsch said his own transition from Omaha to Papillion has been a smooth one. "These are great folks that I'm having the privilege to lead, and I have been very much impressed with their knowledge and professionalism. I'm excited to continue on," said Gottsch.

September is Library Card Sign-Up Month

What's cooler than being cool? Having a library card of course! September is Library Card Sign-Up Month, and we want YOU! From borrowing books, ebooks, and magazines to playing a game, meeting new friends or attending storytime, a library card will take you on many adventures.

Get a library card and learn how to draw. Use your library card to explore on our iPads or use our free zoo passes. A library card is truly a valuable tool that provides countless hours of enjoyment.

Check the chart to the right to see who is eligible to apply for a no-cost library card. Non-residents (those living in a Sanitary Improvement District (SID) or outside the city limits) may also obtain membership by paying a fee as set forth in the City's Master Fee Ordinance.

New patrons requesting a library card will be required to show identification with proof of address at the time of request. Library cards can be issued to all who are 16 years of age and older, and minors ages 5-15, with parental consent.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR A NO-COST LIBRARY CARD?

Anyone age 16+ (& minors 5-15 with parental permission) who:

- Resides within the City
- Pays property taxes in La Vista
- Owns a business in La Vista

Additionally, anyone who is:

- Employed by the City of La Vista
- A member of the Papillion Fire Department
- A teacher/faculty in La Vista Public Schools
- Current Metro Community College students





CODE ENFORCEMENT CORNER

With more nice weather ahead of us this year, here are some seasonal reminders about La Vista City ordinances.

- Grass, weeds and worthless vegetation cannot reach a height of 12 inches. For a more detailed list of weeds, visit CityofLaVista.org/MunicipalCode and view ordinance #133.01 under the General Offenses section.
- Tree limbs must be kept at least eight feet above the sidewalk. Limbs that hang over the street must be at least 15 feet above the street to allow for vehicle clearance.
- Motor vehicles may not be parked on a non-hard surface, except during snow emergencies. Trailers and campers may only be parked on a non-hard surface from October thru April.
- Vehicles shall be parked facing traffic. Vehicles cannot be parked more than 72 hours, or parked on the side of the street marked with a "No parking this side of street" sign. This is for safety and to ensure there is room for a fire truck or rescue squad to pass through.
- No signs may be placed in the right of way. While permits are not needed for garage sales or auctions, signs must be 12 feet from the curb on local streets, 25 feet from the curb on collector or arterial streets, and 50 feet from the curb on major arterial streets. Collector and other arterial streets include Giles Rd., Harrison St., 66th St., 72nd St., 96th St. and 108th St. Major arterial streets include 84th St. and 144th St. Signs placed in the right of way will be removed and discarded.

Progress underway on street improvement projects.

Major projects on the east side of La Vista have kept the Streets division of the Public Works Department busy this summer. Brady Small, La Vista's Street Superintendent, shared an update on the City's street projects.

East La Vista Sewer and Pavement Rehabilitation

In early May crews began this two-year project to rehabilitate the aging sewer infrastructure in the House of Nines, La Vista's original neighborhood east of 72nd Street. Work is progressing on phase one of the project, which will wrap up in approximately November with optional work as weather allows through the winter months. The 2024 construction season will see the phase two improvements with anticipated completion by November 2024. Crestview Heights UBAS

Crews are substantially complete on this project, which provided concrete base repair and a UBAS (ultra-thin bonded asphalt surface) treatment to the Crestview Heights area on Josephine St., Gertrude St., Emilie St., 76th St., 75th Ave., 75th St., 74th Ave. and 74th St.

78th St., Terry Dr. and Lillian Ave. Milling & Overlay

As of early July crews were nearing completion on this project, which was a complete rehabilitation of these three streets. The type of work at each location varied and included concrete pavement repair, curb repair, replacement of curb inlet tops, sidewalk curb ramps, asphalt resurfacing and/or street reconstruction. This project should be substantially complete by the beginning of August.
