

WHAT IS A LIBRARY?

A library is a place to connect people, resources and experiences. It's a place where ALL people are welcome to learn through reading, discovering, socializing, and creating. A library is a community of empowered learners, enthusiastic readers and engaged citizens.

The Library is always a hub of activity, and this spring and summer will be no exception! Here are some updates about what has been going on at the Library, which are new to you?

- La Vista Public Library was nominated for the National Medal for Museums and Library Service award.
- Library staff applied for \$10,754 in grants and successfully secured \$5,454. A grant from the La Vista Community Foundation allowed for the addition of a heat press and mug press. A number of memorials were received by the Library, including a donation of \$4,000 honoring Karla J. Stowe to be used towards books for literacy, two internships and a summer children's program.
- The Library received an "on loan" ONYX Deskset HD video magnifier through a partnership with the Nebraska Library Commission and Nebraska Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired.
- A partnership with Omaha Astronomical Society allowed the Library to add a telescope kit to its collection.
- New audio-visual equipment was purchased for the main meeting rooms, and new carpet was installed in the meeting and conference rooms.
- The public libraries of Sarpy County, including La Vista Public Library, held a joint author event featuring Alex Kava.
- The Library made City flag kits available. (Think of Flat Stanley in the form of a La Vista flag!) Check one out to take with you on vacation.

Any person who resides within the legal City limits of La Vista, pays property taxes to the City of La Vista or is a La Vista business owner may apply for a library card. In addition, any person who is an employee of the City of La Vista, a member of the Papillion Fire Department, a teacher or faculty member in a La Vista Public School, a current student, faculty or staff of Metropolitan Community College may apply for a library card at no charge.

Non-residents (those living in a Sanitary Improvement District or outside the city limits) may obtain membership by paying a fee as set forth in the City's Master Fee Ordinance. Due to an agreement between the City and SID 237, the City agrees to provide an annual library membership for access and use of library services of the La Vista Public Library to residents of SID 237 who satisfy applicable requirements to obtain a library membership.

Military personnel: There is no charge for a library card for active military personnel who live in Sarpy County. Active military personnel who are not residents of La Vista must present a military ID to obtain a library card.

New patrons requesting a library card will be required to show identification with proof of address at the time of request. Library cards can be issued to all who are 16 years of age and older, and minors ages 5-15, with parental consent.

BORROWING PRIVILEGES

Within the La Vista Public Library, the use of all materials is open to the public. Service will not be denied or abridged because of religious, racial, social, economic, political or age status. The use of the Library or its services may be denied for due cause including, but not limited to, failure to return books or pay fees, destruction of Library property, or failure to abide by stated policies.

COMPUTERS & WiFi

Computers, high-speed internet, free Wi-Fi, wireless printing and Microsoft Office are available to the public. Black and white printouts cost \$0.10 per page/side, and color printouts cost \$0.50 per page/side.

iPADS

Library cardholders in good standing can borrow an iPad to use within the Library. To checkout an iPad, cardholders must be 18 years old or older and fill out the iPad Usage Agreement form. iPads can be borrowed for 60 minutes at a time with time extension options available.

Text **402.204.1537** to text-chat with a librarian. You can easily renew your books, receive notification whenever items are overdue or ask a reference question. For privacy reasons, titles of books and personal information will not be shared through Gabbie.

DIGITAL RESOURCES

The La Vista Public Library offers online resources including electronic books, magazines, streaming media and streaming music that can be accessed at the Library or from any computer with an Internet connection. The ability to access information for those resources that require a username and password is also available at the Library. TELESCOPE


Explore the night sky with your library card.




CATAN

Mindy: *Inheritance* by Nora Roberts


