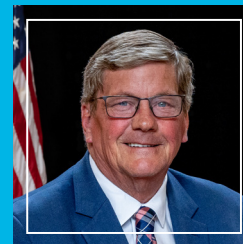

## La Vista honors Ron and Pat Hollins as its 2025 Military Family of the Year

The City of La Vista selects a local family with demonstrated military service to recognize at La Vista Days each year. This year, the City is proud to celebrate La Vista residents and Air Force veterans Ron and Pat Hollins as La Vista's Military Family of the Year.

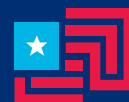
Ron, originally from Indiana, was inspired to join the military by his father's service during World War II and his brothers' service in the Air Force and Army. In 1969, Ron enlisted in the Air Force, beginning his 22-year military career that sent him to locations like Thailand, Germany, Idaho, Maine and Florida. As an aircraft refueler stationed in Thailand during the Vietnam War, Ron played a valuable role in helping keep planes in the air around the clock. Although his service took him across the globe, Ron believes that the friendliest people he encountered were in Nebraska when he was stationed at Offutt Air Force Base. This drew Ron to return to Nebraska after retiring from the Air Force in 1991.

Pat, a native of Hastings, Nebraska, joined the Air Force in pursuit of her education and a chance to explore the world beyond her small town. Her first year of service took her to Texas for basic training in San Antonio, followed by technical training in Wichita Falls. Pat's other assignments landed her in Greece for two years and then at the Pentagon for a year. While stationed at the Pentagon, Pat worked as an electronics technician with the overseas Autobahn telephone system. After completing four years of service, she returned home to Nebraska, having gained a wealth of experiences from her time in the military.

Despite both having served in the Air Force, Ron and Pat didn't cross paths until several years after retiring from military life. Their first meeting was at the Papillion Post Office where Ron worked as a mail carrier and Pat was a clerk. The pair married in 2004 and they've enjoyed building a life together in La Vista.

***Ron said he has adored every minute of living in La Vista. Pat agreed, adding that she loves that La Vista has "great neighborhoods, great people and is casual—not too rushed."***

"This is home," said Pat. Look for Ron, Pat and members of their family in the La Vista Days Parade on Saturday, May 31.

#### Fireworks & Drone Viewing

## Celebrating La Vista's Employee of the Year: Meg Harris

Finance Director Meg Harris was recognized as La Vista's 2024 Employee of the Year at the City's employee recognition event recently.

Although Meg has only been employed with the City for two

years, she's made a major impact in that short time.

"There was significant work to be done when she started with the City—and coming from the private sector—there was a lot for her to learn about government finance and government operations in general," said Rita Ramirez, Interim City Administrator.

"Meg does not back down from a challenge, and she has worked hard to revamp critical processes and improve efficiency."

Meg played a key role in several of the City's most important organizational projects over the past year. For example, she assisted with revising processes related to the City's Capital Improvement Plan, helping

improve measurability and return on investment.

**Undoubtedly, Meg's largest contribution since her arrival has been implementing a new investment strategy that helped strengthen and diversify the City's revenue base. As a result of her efforts, the City has earned a much higher return on its investments, bringing in over \$2 million in additional revenue earned.**

## City reviewing sound study results

The Astro Amphitheater's summer concert season is underway. With more than 20 outdoor shows scheduled to take place at the amphitheater over the next few months, the City is currently reviewing results from an independent sound study conducted by WJHW that measured noise outputs from an outdoor concert on October 18, 2024.

Despite receiving fewer than 50 noise complaints related to concerts during the 2024 season, the City commissioned the sound study to better understand sound levels in areas surrounding the amphitheater.

To measure sound levels from the outdoor concert, readings were taken from seven different locations ranging from inside the amphitheater to as far north as 84th Street and Park Drive in Ralston.

While the City recognizes sound readings may fall within the acceptable range for concerts, City officials will be sharing the findings with The Astro and working with the venue to determine if there are adjustments that can be made to lessen the impact of concert noise and minimize disruptions to the community.

**LIGHTING UP LA VISTA** When La Vista residents and visitors to the City enjoy time outdoors this summer, they'll have a brighter view of their surroundings thanks to two recent projects. New lights were installed this spring in Central Park, and the old lighting was replaced at the La Vista Sports Complex.



## An added glow in Central Park

Adding lights throughout Central Park, Central Park East and The Link was the latest phase of the City's development of this area. The City partnered with a contractor to install shorter lights around the pedestrian paths, and taller lights around the parking lots and fire lane (where more light is needed for vehicles).

Before the upgrade, several areas of the park—especially around Central Park East near the shelter and tennis courts—lacked sufficient lighting. Recognizing the need for additional lighting throughout the park, the City Council authorized \$606,994 to pay for the project. The new lights will help improve safety and ensure that park-goers feel secure during all hours of the day and night.

The park light fixtures are environmentally friendly—all lights are LED, energy-efficient and long-lasting. They are also “dark sky compliant,” meaning they are designed to direct light downward, minimizing light pollution. This thoughtful design limits upward light projection, ensuring neighboring properties aren't negatively impacted by excess light.

Another intentional design feature is the inclusion of power outlets on the light poles. The outlets provide opportunities to connect holiday decorations and supply electrical power for City events hosted in the park.

The lighting project faced a few hurdles that slowed installation including vandalism during construction and delays caused by winter weather. Despite these challenges, the finished project has greatly enhanced the park's functionality and visual appeal, making it a safer, more vibrant space.

## La Vista Sports Complex scores improved lighting

The four baseball/softball fields at the La Vista Sports Complex now boast a better playing experience thanks to new LED lighting that was installed earlier this year. The newly unveiled lights replaced lights that were original to the complex and had become expensive to maintain due to outdated replacement parts.

Public Works staff partnered with Musco Lighting—an industry leader in sports lighting—to help modernize the field lights at the Sports Complex. Musco designed and installed a system that minimizes light pollution, can be controlled remotely from an app and computer and includes a ball tracker feature to help players track high fly balls.

Jason Allen, La Vista's Parks Superintendent, explained that the ballfields at the Sports Complex are used most every night of the week from April 1 through November 1.

***“The ability to program the lights remotely to automatically turn on and off is more efficient and will cost the City less,” said Allen.***

In addition to replacing the field lights, a security light was added at the complex to provide better lighting for the walkway from the parking lot to the concession stand.

The City invested \$950,000 into the replacement lights, which come with a full 25-year warranty.

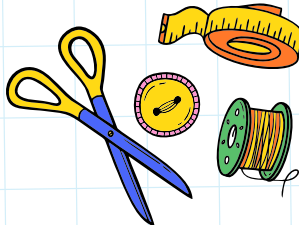

## Protect your home while you're on vacation or away travelling by following these tips from the La Vista Police Department:

- Program exterior lights and at least one interior light on a timer.
- Keep all doors and windows locked and blinds drawn.
- Place a stop on mail delivery and enlist the help of someone to bring packages inside.
- Adjust thermostat accordingly for the season.
- Employ lawn care for extended absences.

Additionally, consider registering for Vacation Watch if you are going to be away from home for an extended period of time. Vacation Watch allows homeowners to request a house check by law enforcement when gone for three or more days. There is no maximum number of days set, but a return date must be provided when submitting a request. **The Vacation Watch service applies to vacation absences only; no vacant home will be watched.**
