LA VISTA CITY COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 20, 2019

A meeting of the City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 6:00 p.m. on August 20, 2019. Present were Councilmembers Frederick, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale, and Sell. Also in attendance were City Attorney McKeon, City Administrator Gunn, Assistant City Administrator Ramirez, City Clerk Buethe, Police Chief Lausten, Director of Public Works Soucie, Director of Administrative Services Pokorny, Library Director Barcal, Recreation Director Stopak, Finance Director Miserez, City Engineer Kottmann, and Human Resources Director Trail.

2. ORDINANCE

Councilmember Thomas introduced Ordinance No. 1365 entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA LEVYING AND IMPOSING RESTAURANTS AND DRINKING PLACES OCCUPATION TAX AS SECTION 113.10 OF THE LA VISTA MUNICIPAL CODE; SPECIFYING

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ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS AND USE OF TAX PROCEEDS; REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, PUBLICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.





BACKGROUND

The initial contract for the parking structure project was awarded to Hawkins Construction Co. in the amount of \$3,863,000.00 on November 21, 2017. Previous Change Orders through No. 13 increased the contract price to \$4,146,122.91. Change Order No.14 does not change the contract amount.

This change order revises the current substantial completion date of September 13, 2019 and creates two substantial completion dates. The first date will be September 3, 2019 to complete pavement to the extent required to allow access to the Lot 15 lower level private parking garage. The second date for the completion of the rest of Parking Structure No. 1 will be October 4, 2019.

SYNOPSIS

A resolution has been prepared to approve an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of La Vista and Douglas County for Forensic and Crime Scene Investigation Services.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Interlocal Agreement does not increase or change current charges for Crime Scene Services that have been in place. Charges are based on services used. The police department uses services from Douglas County in complex cases and has averaged approximately \$5,000 per year in recent years. Funds have been budgeted for these services.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval

BACKGROUND

Douglas County has provided forensic and crime scene services to La Vista for the past 20 years. In 2009, the services were formalized with the approval of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with Douglas County. It was renewed in November 2014. The agreement expires this month and we would like to renew for another five years.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH DOUGLAS COUNTY FOR FORENSIC AND CRIME SCENE INVESTIGATION SERVICES.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted under Neb. Rev. Statute 13-801, et. Seq. Reissue 1997, the Mayor and City Council determine that it is in the best interest of the City to renew an interlocal cooperation agreement for the purpose of providing forensic and crime scene investigation services in an efficient and effective manner; and

WHEREAS, the La Vista Police Department has a need for forensic and crime scene investigation services; and

WHEREAS, Douglas County, Nebraska is qualified to provide such services as described in the attached Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.

WHEREAS, Douglas County, Nebraska entered into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with the City of La Vista for forensic and crime scene investigation services in November of 2009 and the City of La Vista has been satisfied with the services provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of La Vista, Nebraska, hereby authorize the Mayor to execute an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with Douglas County for forensic and crime scene investigation services.

**SERVICES AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
DOUGLAS COUNTY, NEBRASKA
AND
La Vista, NEBRASKA**

Under the authority of the Nebraska Inter-local Cooperation Act, Article 8 of Chapter 13 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes, this Agreement is entered into between the Douglas County, Nebraska, (herein after “Douglas County”) a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, by and through the Douglas County Sheriff, and The City of La Vista, a *political subdivision of the State of Nebraska/municipal corporation of the State of Nebraska*, (herein called “*Requesting Agency*”) for the purpose of providing forensic services.

**SECTION ONE
DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

A. Duties of Douglas County

1. Provide the forensic and crime scene services as specified in Schedule of Forensic Services which is attached and incorporated hereunto as Exhibit A and shall strive to respond to any request for assistance in a timely manner.
2. Provide and train personnel as necessary to perform forensic services specified in the Schedule of Forensic Services and as determined by the County Sheriff exercising professional judgment. Said personnel will at all times remain under the management and control of Douglas County. Employment rights of personnel assigned to provide services will not be abridged.
3. Reserve the sole right to determine its own availability to perform the forensic service request. This Agreement shall not be construed to require Douglas County to hire any new or additional personnel to perform forensic services.
4. Provide all equipment and facilities necessary to process a crime scene and to conduct laboratory analysis as specified in the Schedule of Forensic Services.
5. Process evidence in reliance upon the assumption that the evidence was collected and packaged in accordance with the Douglas County Sheriff’s Office, Forensic Services Bureau’s (FSB) packaging guidelines, to which the current guidelines are attached and incorporated hereunto and subject to periodic review and revision by Douglas County. Further, Douglas County retains the right to refuse evidence for forensic

processing and/or refuse to process or reprocess evidence submitted to the Douglas County Forensic Services Bureau if Douglas County believes, in its sole discretion, that the evidence has been compromised and/or otherwise contaminated.

6. Designate a Douglas County Crime Scene Investigation lead crime scene investigator upon arrival to a crime scene and said lead crime scene investigator shall coordinate services with the Requesting Agency's on-site command officer.
7. The lead crime scene investigator will notify the requesting agency of any breach noted while at crime scene or with evidence collected and/or processed.
8. The Douglas County Forensic Services Bureau has extensive dedicated equipment and facilities to ensure the provision of highly professional crime scene investigation and forensic services. Specific arrangements for the use of equipment and/or facilities is necessarily limited to assigned Douglas County Sheriffs Office personnel.
9. Provide written findings upon completion of any forensic analysis-performed. All records, reports, and documents concerning the performance of services provided by Douglas County Sheriffs Office personnel will be appropriately recorded and securely maintained in accordance with Sheriffs Office records/reporting directives and the State Records Retention Act.
10. Send written notification to the authorized representative of the Requesting Agency upon completion of forensic analysis for each item(s) of evidence submitted to Douglas County Forensic Services Bureau.
11. Invoice the Requesting Agency on a monthly basis or as forensic services are provided by Douglas County, whichever is the earlier to occur. The invoice will reflect actual services rendered on each item submitted for forensic analysis. Crime scene investigation services and deposition and/or court appearances will be billed for a minimum of two (2) hours with additional time billed in 30 minute increments.
12. Update the Schedule of Forensic Services, attached as Exhibit A, no less than annually and provide a copy of said Schedule to the Requesting Agency's authorized representative no less than thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of said Schedule.

B. Duties of Requesting Agency

1. Submit evidence to the Douglas County Forensic Services Bureau in accordance with the current Douglas County Sheriff's Office, Forensic Services Bureau's packaging guidelines, to which the current guidelines are attached and incorporated hereunto and subject to periodic review and revision by Douglas County. It is the sole responsibility of the Requesting Agency to comply with said packaging guidelines in effect on the day the evidence is submitted.

2. Submit a request for forensic service(s) that will be completed by the Forensic Services Bureau in a timely manner. The Requesting Agency shall pay an additional charge to Douglas County when such tests require expedient handling and/or additional personnel or services to meet a specific time requirement requested by the Requesting Agency. Douglas County reserves the right to refuse to perform the forensic services if it deems, in its sole discretion, that the service cannot be complete on or before the requested date.
3. Crime Scene Services:
 - i. Requesting Agency agrees to designate one Requesting Agency law enforcement official on site as a command officer to coordinate all communications with the Douglas County Sheriff's Office lead crime scene investigator. Said command officer shall be designated before or upon arrival of Douglas County Crime Scene Investigation Unit personnel at a crime scene and shall remain the command officer throughout the investigation.
 - ii. Requesting Agency agrees to maintain the crime scene in accordance with the current National Institute of Justice guidelines in effect on the day the crime scene is discovered.
 1. In the event that there has been a breach of crime scene integrity before the arrival of Douglas County Crime Scene Investigation Unit personnel, Requesting Agency's command officer shall report the nature and details of the breach at the time of arrival to said scene to Douglas County's lead crime scene investigator.
 2. In the event that a breach of crime scene integrity is discovered during or after the arrival of Douglas County Crime Scene Investigation Unit personnel, Requesting Agency's command officer shall notify Douglas County's lead crime scene investigator immediately and report the nature and details of the breach to the authorized representative of the Douglas County Sheriff within twenty-four (24) hours.
4. Claim and take possession of item(s) and evidence submitted to Douglas County Forensic Services Bureau for forensic analysis within one week after notification that testing of said item(s) is complete. Douglas County will not be responsible for evidence storage and disposal and is released from any liability for any item(s) and/or evidence unclaimed by the Requesting Agency eight days after said notification. The Requesting Agency may also be subject to additional storage fees for said unclaimed evidence.

5. Cooperate at all times with the employees and representatives of the Douglas County Sheriff's Office providing services under this Agreement.
6. Make payment for provided services no more than thirty (30) days after receipt of an invoice reasonably documenting all applicable charges and fees.

SECTION TWO

TERM, DURATION, REVIEW, REVISION, AND TERMINATION

This Agreement shall become effective on December 1, 2019 and shall remain in effect until November 30, 2024, a term no greater than five (5) years. This Agreement may be terminated upon mutual written consent of the parties or by either of the parties giving sixty (60) days written notice to the other of its intention to terminate the Agreement. Any termination of this Agreement will not relieve either Party of obligations previously incurred pursuant to this Agreement, including payments which may be due and owing at the time of termination. Upon expiration, this Agreement may be extended or renewed for an additional term by mutual written agreement of the Parties. A review of the agreement will be conducted annually or more often as needed. Revision of the Agreement may be conducted as needed/deemed necessary by Douglas County.

SECTION THREE

GENERAL PROVISIONS

A Independent Contractors.

It is agreed that nothing contained herein is intended or should be construed in any manner as creating or establishing a partnership or joint venture between the Parties. Any and all acts that either Party or its personnel, employees, agents or contractors perform pursuant to the terms of this Agreement shall be undertaken as independent contractors and not as employees of the other. The Parties shall, except as provided herein, act in their individual capacities and not as agents, employees, partners, joint ventures or associates of the other. An employee or agent of one shall not be deemed or construed to be the employee or agent of the other for any purpose whatsoever. None of the Parties nor its personnel, employees, agents or contractors shall be entitled to any benefits of the other. The Parties shall not provide any insurance coverage to the other or their employees including, but not limited to, workers' compensation insurance. Each Party shall pay all wages, salaries and other amounts due its employees and shall be responsible

for all reports, obligations, and payments pertaining to social security taxation, income tax withholding, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, group insurance coverage, collective bargaining agreements or any other such similar matters. Any and all claims that may or might arise under the Workers' Compensation Act of the State of Nebraska on behalf of said personnel or other persons while so engaged, and any and all claims whatsoever on behalf of any such person or personnel arising out of employment or alleged employment, including without limitation claims of discrimination against a Party its officers, employees, agents or contractors shall in no way be the responsibility of the other Party. Neither Party shall have any authority to bind the other by or with any contract or agreement, nor to impose any liability upon the other. All acts and contracts of each shall be in its own name and not in the name of the other, unless otherwise provided herein.

B. Nondiscrimination.

Both Parties agree that in accordance with the Nebraska Fair Employment Practice Act, Neb.Rev.Stat. §48-1122, they will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment, to be employed in the performance of this Agreement, with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment because of the age, race, color, religion, sex, disability, or national origin of the employee or applicant. None of the Parties shall, in the performance of this Agreement, discriminate or permit discrimination in violation of any applicable federal or state laws or local ordinances.

C. Captions.

Captions used in this Agreement are for convenience and are not used in the construction of this Agreement.

Unless otherwise indicated, all references to "Articles," "Sections" and other subdivisions are to the corresponding Articles, Sections or subdivisions of this Agreement; and the words "herein," "hereinbefore," "hereinafter," "hereof," "hereunder" and other words of similar import refer to this Agreement as a whole and not to any particular Article, Section or subdivision hereof.

D. Applicable Law and Venue.

Parties to this Agreement shall conform to all existing and applicable city ordinances, resolutions, state and local laws, federal laws, and all existing and applicable rules and regulations. Nebraska law will govern the terms and the performance under this Agreement. Venue for any non-federal legal proceeding under this Agreement shall be in the State of

Nebraska, District Court of Douglas County and for any federal legal proceeding in the United States District Court for the State of Nebraska located in Omaha Nebraska.

E. Entire Agreement

This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the Parties. The provisions of this Agreement may not be explained, supplemented, or qualified through evidence of trade usage or prior course of dealings. No representations were made or relied upon by either Party other than those that are expressly set forth herein. No agent, employee or other representative of either Party is empowered to alter any of the terms hereof except as provided herein.

F. Amendments/Modification.

This Agreement may be modified only by written amendment, duly executed by authorized officials of the Parties. No alteration or variation of the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the Parties hereto. Every amendment shall specify the date on which its provisions shall be effective.

G. Assignment.

None of the Parties may assign its rights under this Agreement without the express prior written consent of the other Party. An assignment without such prior written consent shall be a material breach of this Agreement.

H. Successors and Assigns Bound by Covenants.

All covenants, stipulations and agreements in this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and extend to and bind the legal representatives, successors, and assigns of the respective Parties hereto.

I. Waiver.

The failure of either Party to insist on strict performance of any covenants or conditions, or to exercise any option herein conferred on any one or more instances, shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of any such covenant, condition, right, or option, but the same shall remain in full force and effect. For a waiver of a right or power to be effective, it must be in writing signed by the waiving Party. An effective waiver of a right or power shall not be construed as either a future or continuing waiver of that same right or power, or the waiver of any other right or power. In addition, any act by either Party which is it not obligated to do hereunder shall not be deemed to impose any obligation upon that Party to do any similar act in the future or in any way change or alter any of the provisions of this Agreement.

J. Severability.

If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or otherwise unenforceable, that provision will be severed and the remainder of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect.

K. Notice of Breach.

Either Party shall provide written notice to the other of breach of this Agreement, upon which notice the receiving party shall have ten business days to cure such breach to the mutual satisfaction of the Parties. During the cure period, the Parties shall act in good faith to perform their respective duties described herein.

L. Indemnification

Requesting Agency shall assume all risk of loss, indemnify, defend and hold Douglas County and its employees, agents, assignees and legal representatives harmless from all liability, loss, expense, cost, attorney's fees, claim, judgment, suit and / or cause of action (whether or not meritorious), settlement, or demand for personal injury, death or damage to tangible property (hereinafter "Claim") which may accrue against County to the extent it is caused by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Requesting Party, its officers, employees, agents, assigns and / or subcontractors. .

The provisions of this section shall survive expiration or termination of this Agreement.

These Indemnification provisions are not intended to waive a Party's sovereign immunity. A Party's liability is governed by and limited to the extent provided by the Nebraska Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act or other applicable provisions of law.

M. No Third Party Rights.

This Agreement is executed for the benefit of the named parties only. This Agreement is not intended to, nor shall it provide third parties, excluding any assignment as provided herein, with any remedy, claim, liability, reimbursement, cause of action or other right or privilege; except that this Agreement's indemnification provision shall also inure to the benefit of a Party's employees, officers and agents.

N. Authorized Representatives and Notice.

Except for any notice required under applicable law to be given in another manner, any notice or communication required or permitted hereunder shall be given in further consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the Parties hereto expressly agree that for purposes of

notice, during the term of this Agreement and for the period of any applicable statute of limitations thereafter, the following named individuals shall be the authorized representatives of the Parties:

Notice shall be in writing and shall be effective upon receipt. Delivery may be by hand, in which case a signed receipt shall be obtained, or by United States mail, registered or certified, return receipt requested or by facsimile with a signed return facsimile acknowledging receipt. A Party's contact person may be changed by at any time by providing written notice of the updated contact information to all the Parties.

O. Unavailability of Funding language

Due to possible future reductions including but not limited to County, State and/or Federal appropriations, Douglas County cannot guarantee the continued availability of funding for this Agreement, notwithstanding the consideration stated in this Agreement. In the event funds to finance this Agreement become unavailable either in full or in part due to such reduction in appropriations, Douglas County may terminate the Agreement or reduce the consideration upon notice in writing to Contractor. The notice shall be delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, or in person with proof of delivery. Douglas County shall be the final authority as to the availability of funds. The effective date of such Agreement termination or reduction in consideration shall be specified in the notice as the date of service of the notice or the actual effective date of the County, State and/or Federal funding reduction, whichever is later. Provided, that reduction shall not apply to payments made for services satisfactorily completed prior to the effective date. In the event of a reduction of consideration, Contractor may cancel this Agreement as of the effective date of the proposed reduction upon the provision of advance written notice to Douglas County.

P. Drug Free Policy.

Requesting Agency has established, maintains, and enforces a drug free workplace policy.

Q. New Employee Work Eligibility Status (Neb. Rev. Stat. § 4-114).

Requesting Agency is required and hereby agrees to use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within Nebraska. A federal immigration verification system means the electronic verification of the work authorization program authorized by the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, 8 U.S.C. 1324a, known as the E-Verify Program, or an equivalent federal program designated by the United States Department of Homeland Security or other federal agency authorized to verify the work eligibility status of a newly hired employee.

R. Public Benefits.

With regard to Neb.Rev.Stat. §§4-108 - 113, neither Party is an individual or sole proprietorship. Therefore, neither Party is subject to the public benefits attestation and related requirements of Neb.Rev.Stat. §§4-108 – 113.

S. Joint Work Product.

This Agreement is the joint work product of both Parties; accordingly, in the event of any ambiguity, no presumption shall be imposed against or in favor of either Party by reason of document preparation.

T. Authority.

Each of the persons signing below warrant and represent that they have the authority to enter into this Agreement and to bind the parties hereto.

U. Insurance.

Requesting Agency shall maintain comprehensive General Liability insurance with limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for each person and Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) for each occurrence and shall provide proof thereof. Requesting Agency agrees to provide and maintain throughout the term of this Agreement and at its own expense adequate statutory Nebraska workers' compensation insurance and shall provide proof thereof. Annually and at least 60 days before the effective date of any material change in or cancellations of, such insurance, written notice shall be mailed by the Requesting Agency's insurance carrier to Douglas County Purchasing. The policies required to be maintained shall be with companies rated A or better in the most current issue of A.M. Best's Insurance Ratings Guide. Insurers shall be licensed to do business in the state of Nebraska and domiciled in the USA. Douglas County shall be named as an additional insured on Requesting Agency's Certificates of Insurance except for Workers' Compensation policies/certificates. Requesting Agency shall

provide a certificate of insurance to Douglas County Purchasing. Requesting Agency shall provide the certificate(s) before work or services are undertaken pursuant to this Agreement and annually thereafter at least thirty (30) prior to the policy expiration date. All insurance documents and insurance notifications shall be sent to:

Douglas County does not represent in any way that the insurance specified herein, whether in scope of coverage or limits, is adequate or sufficient to protect Requesting Agency or its interests. Requesting Agency is solely responsible to determine its need for and to procure additional coverage which may be needed in connection with this Agreement. The procuring of insurance as required by this Agreement shall not be construed to limit Requesting Agency's liability hereunder or to fulfill the indemnification provisions of this Agreement.

V. No Separate Legal Entity

This Agreement does not create a separate legal entity under the Interlocal Cooperation Act. For purposes of that Act, this Agreement shall be administered jointly by the Parties, in the event of a conflict, the Douglas County Sheriff's decision shall govern. This Agreement does not contemplate acquiring, holding or disposing of joint property nor does it contemplate the levying or collecting of any tax.

W. Conflict of Interest.

In the performance of this Agreement, Requesting Agency will avoid all conflicts of interests or appearances of conflict of interest. Requesting Agency will report any conflict of interest immediately to County. Requesting Agency assures County that no County employee will have a financial or personal interest in this Agreement. Requesting Agency did not and will not provide any money or other benefit of any kind to any County employee in the procuring of, facilitation of, execution of or during the duration of this Agreement.

X. Dispute Resolution.

Any dispute which, in the judgment of a Party to this Agreement, may affect the performance of such Party shall be reduced to writing and delivered to the other Party. As soon as possible thereafter, the Parties authorized representatives shall schedule a face to face meeting in Omaha, Nebraska to resolve the dispute in a mutually satisfactory manner. Prior to the institution of any formal legal proceeding, the Parties must meet in this manner to resolve the

dispute. This meeting must take place within ten (10) business days after service of the written statement of dispute. During the pendency of negotiations, the Parties shall act in good faith to perform their respective duties described herein.

SYNOPSIS

This ordinance comes before Council for second reading to implement a 1.5% Restaurants and Drinking Places Occupation Tax.

FISCAL IMPACT

The City projects proceeds up to \$700,000 annually.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval.

BACKGROUND

The proposed Restaurants and Drinking Places occupation tax comes before Council for the second reading. The first reading of the ordinance was held on August 20, 2019. With the majority vote of Council, the ordinance passed the first reading and has moved to the second reading.

There is one amendment to the ordinance since the first reading. The amendment would allow restaurants and drinking places to withhold 2% of the occupation tax to cover administrative costs and expenses connected to the tax.

ORDINANCE NO. 1365

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA LEVYING AND IMPOSING RESTAURANTS AND DRINKING PLACES OCCUPATION TAX AS SECTION 113.10 OF THE LA VISTA MUNICIPAL CODE; SPECIFYING ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS AND USE OF TAX PROCEEDS; REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, PUBLICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA, as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista desire to levy and impose a new Restaurants and Drinking Places Occupation Tax as Section 113.10 of the La Vista Municipal Code as provided in this Ordinance.

Section 2. Section 113.10 of the La Vista Municipal Code is hereby adopted and approved as follows:

“§ 113.10 RESTAURANTS AND DRINKING PLACES OCCUPATION TAX

§ 113.10.0. - DEFINITIONS. As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning:

Applicable Rate shall mean the rate of tax from time to time specified in the master fee ordinance for the tax imposed by this Section 113.10. The initial tax rate of one and one half percent (1.5%) and any subsequent rate as adjusted shall satisfy any applicable requirements of Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 18-1208, including without limitation, that the initial rate or any increased rate or other rate adjustment shall be projected to generate annual occupation tax revenues that are not in excess of the applicable amount listed in Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 18-1208(2), unless approved by registered voters at an election held within the City or otherwise permitted by Nebraska Statutes.

Beverage shall mean any drinkable liquid for humans for hydration, nutrition, taste, pleasure or similar purposes, including without limitation, any such liquid that is frozen, alcoholic or nonalcoholic.

City shall mean the City of La Vista and the area within the corporate limits of the City of La Vista, as adjusted from time to time.

City Clerk shall mean the City of La Vista City Clerk or any designee of the City Clerk.

City Administrator shall mean the City of La Vista City Administrator or any designee of the City Administrator.

Drinking place shall mean any establishment or business offering on-premises consumption of alcoholic and/or nonalcoholic beverages including, but not limited to, bars, taverns, coffee shops, night clubs, dance halls, concession or other types of stands, drive-through, take out, and “to go” facilities, and establishments, facilities, or spaces or areas at or within race tracks, golf courses, sports facilities, meeting or event facilities, arenas, stadiums, hotels, motels, bed and breakfasts, boarding houses, hospitals, grocery stores, shopping centers, convenience stores, supermarkets, or office buildings where beverages are obtained or consumed if a charge is made for them. The term includes all types of facilities, locations and delivery methods by, from or through which a drinking place from time to time might be conducted, including without limitation any permanent, temporary, fixed, mobile, contracted, third party, stand-alone, collocated, joint, or bundled facilities, locations, or delivery methods. Without limiting the foregoing, the term includes caterers, stands and mobile vendors, push carts, beverage wagons or trucks, and other temporary or mobile facilities from which beverages ready for consumption are provided. Also included are places consisting solely of drive-through facilities. A drinking place may also be a restaurant.

(1) The term does not include any establishment or business offering beverages free of charge. The term "free of charge" means without any consideration, donation, contributions, or monetary charges of any nature paid for access to the

beverages and, without limitation, requires the absence of any admission charge, cover charge, table reservation fee, gate charges, seat charges, entertainment fee, green fees, or required minimum purchase of beverages, food, or merchandise.

(2) The term does not include a place offering beverages on premises owned or operated by a civic, charitable, educational, religious, governmental, or political organization exempt from income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code, except as to use of such place or premises by a person that is not exempt from income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code to offer beverages to the public.

Effective Date shall mean October 1, 2019.

Engaged in shall mean to conduct, offer to the public, carry on, or take part in the operation of an enterprise or activity as owner, operator, or agent. Not in limitation of foregoing parts of this definition, a person renting or using a facility, place or premises for a taxable enterprise or activity or service, as a promoter, producer, one-time event, full-time, or otherwise, shall be considered to be engaged in the enterprise or activity.

Food shall mean all edible substances, whether solid, semi-solid, liquid, concentrated, frozen, dried, dehydrated, or otherwise, for ingestion, chewing, or consumption by humans for nutrition, taste, refreshment, pleasure or similar purposes.

Gross receipts shall mean the total amount of receipts, revenues, consideration, donations, contributions, or monetary charges of any nature received for or to provide access to food or beverage without any deduction on account of expenses, taxes, or other costs.

(1) The term includes, without limitation:

- (i) The price charged for food or beverages;
- (ii) Any admission charge, cover charge, membership fee, table reservation fee, gate charges, seat charges, or entertainment fee or similar payment if the payment gives the payor a right to access or obtain food or beverage which is otherwise subject to this tax;
- (iii) The amount received by a person from vendors or contractors who provide food or beverages to that person's customers on or off the premises and which are within the scope of this tax; and
- (iv) Receipts from the sale of beverages or food of a restaurant or drinking place for immediate consumption even if it is not actually consumed on the premises, including without limitation the receipts from prepared "take out," "drive-through," or "to go" food or beverages, or food or beverages provided through a food or beverage delivery platform or other kind of food or beverage delivery service.

(2) The term does not include:

- (i) The value of food or beverages furnished by restaurants or drinking places to employees as part of their compensation when no charge is made to the employees.
- (ii) Tips to an employee of a restaurant or drinking place when the amount of the tip is wholly in the discretion of the purchaser and the full amount of the tip is turned over to the employee, regardless whether or not the tip is paid to the employee or added to the bill.
- (iii) Payments received by a caterer from a civic, charitable, educational, religious, governmental, or political organization exempt from income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code for food or beverage delivered to the premises of the organization;
- (iv) Receipts from sales of food or beverage exempt or otherwise not subject to Nebraska sales and use taxes imposed by the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967, as amended from time to time; or

(v) Receipts from sales of snack foods or beverages, meaning unopened bottles, cans or packages of soft drinks, alcoholic beverages, sports drinks, flavored drinks, bottled water, chewing gum, candy, popcorn, pretzels, nuts, cookies, donuts, crackers, chips, or other items of essentially the same nature, prepackaged in sealed containers and sold for home consumption, except when provided in connection with any prepared food or beverages with respect to which receipts from the snack foods or beverages, together with the prepared food or beverages, are subject to Nebraska sales and use taxes pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967.

Person shall mean any natural person, individual, partnership, association, organization, corporation, or entity of any kind or character engaging in a restaurant or drinking place.

Rate Review Date shall mean the date that is two years after the Effective Date, and every two years thereafter or any other date that the City Council or City Administrator determines necessary or advisable in connection with setting or reviewing a rate or adjusted rate for the tax pursuant to this section in accordance with applicable law.

Rate Review Period shall mean the applicable period ending the day before a Rate Review Date that is used for purposes of reviewing the Applicable Rate.

Restaurant shall mean any place that is kept, used, maintained, advertised, or held out as a place where food is prepared and sold for immediate consumption either on the premises or elsewhere.

(1) The term includes, but is not limited to, cafes, grills, bistros, delicatessens, coffee shops, bakeries, lunch counters, sandwich stands, concession or other types of stands, drive-through, take out, and "to go" facilities, and establishments, facilities, spaces or areas at or within race tracks, golf courses, sports facilities, meeting or event facilities, arenas, stadiums, hotels, motels, bed and breakfasts, boarding houses, hospitals, grocery stores, shopping centers, convenience stores, supermarkets, or office buildings where food is obtained or consumed if a separate charge is made for the food. A restaurant may also be a drinking place. The term includes all types of facilities, locations and delivery methods by, from or through which a restaurant from time to time might be conducted, including without limitation any permanent, temporary, fixed, mobile, contracted, third-party, stand-alone, collocated, joint, or bundled facilities, locations, or delivery methods. Without limiting the foregoing, the term includes caterers, stands and mobile food vendors, push carts, lunch or food wagons or trucks, ice cream trucks, and other temporary or mobile facilities from which food ready for consumption is sold. Also included are places consisting solely of drive-through facilities.

(2) The term does not include:

(i) A place operated by a religious, civic, educational, charitable, governmental, or political organization exempt from income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code where food is offered solely to its members or students;

(ii) A public or private daycare center that offers food solely to its employees or the children staying at the center;

(iii) A convalescent home, nursing home, home for the aged or infirmed, or substance abuse facility that offers food solely to its residents;

(iv) Premises where food is obtained solely from vending machines operated by coin, cards, or other per-purchase operation regardless of whether the food may be consumed on the premises;

(v) Temporary stands at annual festivals or similar events from which food ready for consumption is sold unless entrance to the place at which the food is sold is subject to an admission charge;

(vi) Any establishment or business offering food free of charge. The term "free of charge" means without any consideration, donation, contributions, or monetary charges of any nature paid for access to the food and, without

limitation, requires the absence of any admission charge, cover charge, table reservation fee, gate charges, seat charges, entertainment fee, green fees, or required minimum purchase of food, beverages, or merchandise; or

(vii) A place offering food on premises owned or operated by a civic, charitable, educational, religious, governmental, or political organization exempt from income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code, except as to use of such place or premises by a person that is not exempt from income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code to offer food to the public.

Provided, however, with the exception of subsection (iv), any such place, center, home, facility, premises, establishment, or business described in this subsection "2" shall constitute a restaurant subject to the occupation tax with respect to any receipts from food sales that are subject to Nebraska sales and use taxes pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967.

Retail Sale shall mean sale for use or consumption and not for resale.

Taxpayer shall mean any person engaged in a restaurant or drinking place who is required to pay the tax herein imposed.

§ 113.10.1. – FINDINGS, INTENT AND PURPOSE OF SECTION.

(a) The City Council finds, determines, and declares that persons engaging in restaurants and drinking places are benefited from tourism, leisure, and recreational activities that place unique demands on the City's resources, but which are activities that should be promoted and encouraged. Further, residents and nonresidents who patronize restaurants and drinking places are enjoying a discretionary activity that is dependent upon, and generating revenue from, the restaurant's or drinking place's location within the City and its access to services provided by the City. Subjecting restaurants and drinking places to taxation for purposes of raising revenues is fair, reasonable, appropriate, and just.

(b) Pursuant to the authority of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 16-205, the City Council finds, determines, and declares that restaurants and drinking places form discrete and reasonable classifications of businesses, users of space, or kinds of transactions engaged in within the City and it is appropriate that an occupation tax be imposed on such classifications of businesses, users of space, or kinds of transactions for the purpose of raising revenue to support and further City activities, services, and purposes. These findings, determinations, and declarations are made with due recognition of such businesses, users of space, and transactions within the City and the relation of such businesses, users of space, and transactions to the municipal welfare and the expenditures required of the City, and with consideration of just, proper and equitable distribution of tax burdens within the City as the City Council in its sole discretion determines appropriate, and other proper considerations.

(c) The City Council further determines that some activity or revenue should be excluded from the scope of this section, for reasons including without limitation (i) the activity is offered without charge, (ii) the activity has a primary purpose other than to generate revenue for the business or establishment by the sale of food or drink, (iii) the revenue is generated from activity that does not have the discretionary characteristics and qualities that support using restaurant or drinking place revenue as a measure of determining the amount of taxation, (iv) the sale of food or beverages is primarily intended to encourage and support the civic, charitable, educational, or religious activities of a nonprofit corporation and/or (v) the sale of food or drink is by a nonprofit corporation contracting with the City of La Vista and assessing a tax measured by those sales potentially has the contradictory effect of reducing revenue paid to the City as compensation for the contract.

(d) The restaurants and drinking places occupation tax pursuant to this Section 113.10 is specifically imposed for general revenue purposes and proceeds of the tax shall be deposited in the general fund of the City, except as may otherwise be approved by the City Council from time to time to use or pledge such proceeds for

one or more specific projects of the City and deposit such proceeds in a special fund rather than the City's general fund.

(e) The Mayor and City Council find and determine based on analysis supplied by the City Administrator ("Analysis") that annual revenues generated by the tax at the initial Applicable Rate during the initial period ending on the first Rate Review Date are not projected to exceed \$700,000.00. The Mayor and City Council hereby ratify, affirm, adopt, and approve the Analysis.

§ 113.10.2. – TAX LEVIED AND IMPOSED.

(a) On and after the Effective Date, and in each calendar month thereafter, there is hereby levied and imposed a restaurant and drinking place occupation tax upon each and every person conducting, engaging in, or operating a restaurant or drinking place within the City at any time during a calendar month. The tax shall begin on the Effective Date at 4:00 a.m. The amount of the tax shall be the Applicable Rate of all gross receipts for each calendar month derived from the retail sale of food or beverages of restaurants and drinking places subject to this tax. It shall be unlawful for any person engaging in a restaurant or drinking place to fail to pay the tax required by this section, or to fail to file any return or information required by this section. Each day any such person engages in a restaurant or drinking place after failing to pay the required tax, or failing to file any required return or information, shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as provided in section 10.99 of this Code, in addition to any other remedy provided in this chapter; provided, however, delinquency in payment of the tax required by this section, or conviction for violation of this section, shall not be grounds for suspension or revocation of any other license issued to any person within the City under any licensing provision of this code or other ordinances, or of any license issued by any licensing authority pursuant to Nebraska Statutes.

(b) The City Administrator within an administratively practicable time after each Rate Review Date shall estimate projected annual revenues until the next Rate Review Date and make such recommendations as the City Administrator determines necessary or appropriate, including without limitation, any recommended adjustments to the Applicable Rate or Rate Review Date as determined necessary or appropriate to satisfy applicable Nebraska Statutes, including without limitation Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 18-1208. Such estimates, projections, and any recommended adjustments shall be based on actual revenues from the tax during the applicable Rate Review Period and such other information, factors, or considerations as the City Administrator determines appropriate. Any proposed adjustment to the Applicable Rate shall be presented as an amendment to the master fee ordinance for consideration at a City Council meeting. Any such adjustment, if approved, shall be effective beginning at 4:00 a.m. on the first day of the fiscal year beginning immediately after the adjustment is approved, or on such other date as specified by the City Council.

(c) The tax imposed by this section 113.10 is a tax on the taxpayer for the privilege of engaging in the particular occupations within the City. The person engaged in a restaurant or drinking place may elect to itemize the tax levied and pass the cost of the tax through to customers or purchasers on bills, receipts, or other invoices provided to such customers or purchasers but such itemization and pass-through of the cost of the tax shall not be required and each person engaged in the restaurant or drinking place shall remain liable for the tax imposed by this section.

(d) Notwithstanding anything in this subsection 113.10.2 to the contrary, the City Council at any time shall have the option to submit any proposed tax or tax rate increase described in this section 113.10 to registered voters of the City.

§ 113.10.3. – TAX IMPOSED FOR REVENUE PURPOSES; TAX CUMULATIVE.

(a) The tax imposed by this section is for revenue purposes to support the government of the City and its activities. The levy of the tax under this section is in addition to all other fees, taxes, excises, and licenses levied or imposed under any contract or any other provisions of this code or ordinances of the City from time to time, and in addition to any fee, tax, excise, or license imposed by the State or federal government.

(b) Not in limitation of immediately preceding subsection 113.10.3(a), payment of the tax imposed by this section shall not relieve the person paying it from the payment of any other tax now or hereafter imposed by contract or ordinance or by this Code, including without limitation those imposed for any business or occupation carried on along with the restaurant or drinking place, unless otherwise provided therein. It is the intent of the Council that the occupation tax imposed by this section shall be cumulative unless otherwise expressly provided.

§ 113.10.4. – RETURN AND ADMINISTRATION ALLOWANCE.

(a) Each and every person engaged in a restaurant or drinking place within the City for any period of time on or after the Effective Date shall prepare and file with the City Administrator a return for each calendar month and at the same time pay to the City the tax herein imposed. The return shall be on and in such form and content and include such supporting data as may be prescribed by the City Administrator from time to time, and shall be verified and sworn to by an officer responsible for the restaurant or drinking place, and shall be filed with the City Administrator on or before the last day of the month immediately following receipt of any gross receipts included for purposes of calculating the tax. Returns and tax payments shall be filed and paid (i) hand delivery or by United States mail, properly addressed, postage prepaid and postmarked no later than the last day of the appropriate month, or (ii) by electronic filing and payment by Automated Clearing Housing or Credit Card no later than the last day of the appropriate month, and in accordance with such procedures as prescribed by the City Administrator from time to time.

(b) As reimbursement for any additional administrative costs and expenses connected with the tax, a taxpayer at the time of each tax payment may elect to deduct, withhold, and retain from such payment two percent (2%) of the amount that is otherwise due and payable to the City ("Administration Allowance"). Any payment that is made without reduction for the Administration Allowance shall be deemed an irrevocable election by the taxpayer to forego the Administration Allowance with respect to that payment.

§ 113.10.5. - EFFECTIVE DATE.

The occupation tax imposed by this section shall commence on the Effective Date and shall continue and remain in effect unless terminated by City ordinance. Provided, however, the tax shall be eligible for reconsideration every ten years as follows. The City Council shall vote on any motion of any City Council member at a Council meeting that is seconded directing the City Administrator to prepare a proposed Ordinance to terminate the tax. The motion must be made within the first ninety days of the fiscal year beginning immediately after the ten-year anniversary of such tax, or within the first ninety days of the fiscal year beginning immediately after any subsequent ten-year anniversary. If the motion is approved, the City Administrator shall prepare a proposed Ordinance for consideration of the City Council at a subsequent Council meeting held within an administratively practicable time. If a motion is not made, or if the motion or proposed Ordinance fails, the tax will continue in effect.

Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. Any conflicting provision of any previously enacted ordinance is hereby repealed, effective at midnight on the day before the Effective Date.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista hereby declare that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 5. Publication and Effective Date of Ordinance. This Ordinance shall be published in full and shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1365

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA LEVYING AND IMPOSING RESTAURANTS AND DRINKING PLACES OCCUPATION TAX AS SECTION 113.10 OF THE LA VISTA MUNICIPAL CODE; SPECIFYING ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS AND USE OF TAX PROCEEDS; REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, PUBLICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA, as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista desire to levy and impose a new Restaurants and Drinking Places Occupation Tax as Section 113.10 of the La Vista Municipal Code as provided in this Ordinance.

Section 2. Section 113.10 of the La Vista Municipal Code is hereby adopted and approved as follows:

“§ 113.10 RESTAURANTS AND DRINKING PLACES OCCUPATION TAX

§ 113.10.0. - DEFINITIONS. As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning:

Applicable Rate shall mean the rate of tax from time to time specified in the master fee ordinance for the tax imposed by this Section 113.10. The initial tax rate of one and one half percent (1.5%) and any subsequent rate as adjusted shall satisfy any applicable requirements of Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 18-1208, including without limitation, that the initial rate or any increased rate or other rate adjustment shall be projected to generate annual occupation tax revenues that are not in excess of the applicable amount listed in Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 18-1208(2), unless approved by registered voters at an election held within the City or otherwise permitted by Nebraska Statutes.

Beverage shall mean any drinkable liquid for humans for hydration, nutrition, taste, pleasure or similar purposes, including without limitation, any such liquid that is frozen, alcoholic or nonalcoholic.

City shall mean the City of La Vista and the area within the corporate limits of the City of La Vista, as adjusted from time to time.

City Clerk shall mean the City of La Vista City Clerk or any designee of the City Clerk.

City Administrator shall mean the City of La Vista City Administrator or any designee of the City Administrator.

Drinking place shall mean any establishment or business offering on-premises consumption of alcoholic and/or nonalcoholic beverages including, but not limited to, bars, taverns, coffee shops, night clubs, dance halls, concession or other types of stands, drive-through, take out, and “to go” facilities, and establishments, facilities, or spaces or areas at or within race tracks, golf courses, sports facilities, meeting or event facilities, arenas, stadiums, hotels, motels, bed and breakfasts, boarding houses, hospitals, grocery stores, shopping centers, convenience stores, supermarkets, or office buildings where beverages are obtained or consumed if a charge is made for them. The term includes all types of facilities, locations and delivery methods by, from or through which a drinking place from time to time might be conducted, including without limitation any permanent, temporary, fixed, mobile, contracted, third party, stand-alone, collocated, joint, or bundled facilities, locations, or delivery methods. Without limiting the foregoing, the term includes caterers, stands and mobile vendors, push carts, beverage wagons or trucks, and other temporary or mobile facilities from which beverages ready for consumption are provided. Also included are places consisting solely of drive-through facilities. A drinking place may also be a restaurant.

(1) The term does not include any establishment or business offering beverages free of charge. The term "free of charge" means without any consideration, donation, contributions, or monetary charges of any nature paid for access to the

beverages and, without limitation, requires the absence of any admission charge, cover charge, table reservation fee, gate charges, seat charges, entertainment fee, green fees, or required minimum purchase of beverages, food, or merchandise.

(v) Temporary stands at annual festivals or similar events from which food ready for consumption is sold unless entrance to the place at which the food is sold is subject to an admission charge;

(vi) Any establishment or business offering food free of charge. The term "free of charge" means without any consideration, donation, contributions, or monetary charges of any nature paid for access to the food and, without

limitation, requires the absence of any admission charge, cover charge, table reservation fee, gate charges, seat charges, entertainment fee, green fees, or required minimum purchase of food, beverages, or merchandise; or

(vii) A place offering food on premises owned or operated by a civic, charitable, educational, religious, governmental, or political organization exempt from income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code, except as to use of such place or premises by a person that is not exempt from income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code to offer food to the public.

Provided, however, with the exception of subsection (iv), any such place, center, home, facility, premises, establishment, or business described in this subsection "2" shall constitute a restaurant subject to the occupation tax with respect to any receipts from food sales that are subject to Nebraska sales and use taxes pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967.

Retail Sale shall mean sale for use or consumption and not for resale.

Taxpayer shall mean any person engaged in a restaurant or drinking place who is required to pay the tax herein imposed.

§ 113.10.1. – FINDINGS, INTENT AND PURPOSE OF SECTION.

(a) The City Council finds, determines, and declares that persons engaging in restaurants and drinking places are benefited from tourism, leisure, and recreational activities that place unique demands on the City's resources, but which are activities that should be promoted and encouraged. Further, residents and nonresidents who patronize restaurants and drinking places are enjoying a discretionary activity that is dependent upon, and generating revenue from, the restaurant's or drinking place's location within the City and its access to services provided by the City. Subjecting restaurants and drinking places to taxation for purposes of raising revenues is fair, reasonable, appropriate, and just.

(b) Pursuant to the authority of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 16-205, the City Council finds, determines, and declares that restaurants and drinking places form discrete and reasonable classifications of businesses, users of space, or kinds of transactions engaged in within the City and it is appropriate that an occupation tax be imposed on such classifications of businesses, users of space, or kinds of transactions for the purpose of raising revenue to support and further City activities, services, and purposes. These findings, determinations, and declarations are made with due recognition of such businesses, users of space, and transactions within the City and the relation of such businesses, users of space, and transactions to the municipal welfare and the expenditures required of the City, and with consideration of just, proper and equitable distribution of tax burdens within the City as the City Council in its sole discretion determines appropriate, and other proper considerations.

(c) The City Council further determines that some activity or revenue should be excluded from the scope of this section, for reasons including without limitation (i) the activity is offered without charge, (ii) the activity has a primary purpose other than to generate revenue for the business or establishment by the sale of food or drink, (iii) the revenue is generated from activity that does not have the discretionary characteristics and qualities that support using restaurant or drinking place revenue as a measure of determining the amount of taxation, (iv) the sale of food or beverages is primarily intended to encourage and support the civic, charitable, educational, or religious activities of a nonprofit corporation and/or (v) the sale of food or drink is by a nonprofit corporation contracting with the City of La Vista and assessing a tax measured by those sales potentially has the contradictory effect of reducing revenue paid to the City as compensation for the contract.

(d) The restaurants and drinking places occupation tax pursuant to this Section 113.10 is specifically imposed for general revenue purposes and proceeds of the tax shall be deposited in the general fund of the City, except as may otherwise be approved by the City Council from time to time to use or pledge such proceeds for

one or more specific projects of the City and deposit such proceeds in a special fund rather than the City's general fund.

(e) The Mayor and City Council find and determine based on analysis supplied by the City Administrator ("Analysis") that annual revenues generated by the tax at the initial Applicable Rate during the initial period ending on the first Rate Review Date are not projected to exceed \$700,000.00. The Mayor and City Council hereby ratify, affirm, adopt, and approve the Analysis.

§ 113.10.2. – TAX LEVIED AND IMPOSED.

(a) On and after the Effective Date, and in each calendar month thereafter, there is hereby levied and imposed a restaurant and drinking place occupation tax upon each and every person conducting, engaging in, or operating a restaurant or drinking place within the City at any time during a calendar month. The tax shall begin on the Effective Date at 4:00 a.m. The amount of the tax shall be the Applicable Rate of all gross receipts for each calendar month derived from the retail sale of food or beverages of restaurants and drinking places subject to this tax. It shall be unlawful for any person engaging in a restaurant or drinking place to fail to pay the tax required by this section, or to fail to file any return or information required by this section. Each day any such person engages in a restaurant or drinking place after failing to pay the required tax, or failing to file any required return or information, shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as provided in section 10.99 of this Code, in addition to any other remedy provided in this chapter; provided, however, delinquency in payment of the tax required by this section, or conviction for violation of this section, shall not be grounds for suspension or revocation of any other license issued to any person within the City under any licensing provision of this code or other ordinances, or of any license issued by any licensing authority pursuant to Nebraska Statutes.

(b) The City Administrator within an administratively practicable time after each Rate Review Date shall estimate projected annual revenues until the next Rate Review Date and make such recommendations as the City Administrator determines necessary or appropriate, including without limitation, any recommended adjustments to the Applicable Rate or Rate Review Date as determined necessary or appropriate to satisfy applicable Nebraska Statutes, including without limitation Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 18-1208. Such estimates, projections, and any recommended adjustments shall be based on actual revenues from the tax during the applicable Rate Review Period and such other information, factors, or considerations as the City Administrator determines appropriate. Any proposed adjustment to the Applicable Rate shall be presented as an amendment to the master fee ordinance for consideration at a City Council meeting. Any such adjustment, if approved, shall be effective beginning at 4:00 a.m. on the first day of the fiscal year beginning immediately after the adjustment is approved, or on such other date as specified by the City Council.

(c) The tax imposed by this section 113.10 is a tax on the taxpayer for the privilege of engaging in the particular occupations within the City. The person engaged in a restaurant or drinking place may elect to itemize the tax levied and pass the cost of the tax through to customers or purchasers on bills, receipts, or other invoices provided to such customers or purchasers but such itemization and pass-through of the cost of the tax shall not be required and each person engaged in the restaurant or drinking place shall remain liable for the tax imposed by this section.

(d) Notwithstanding anything in this subsection 113.10.2 to the contrary, the City Council at any time shall have the option to submit any proposed tax or tax rate increase described in this section 113.10 to registered voters of the City.

§ 113.10.3. – TAX IMPOSED FOR REVENUE PURPOSES; TAX CUMULATIVE.

(a) The tax imposed by this section is for revenue purposes to support the government of the City and its activities. The levy of the tax under this section is in addition to all other fees, taxes, excises, and licenses levied or imposed under any contract or any other provisions of this code or ordinances of the City from time to time, and in addition to any fee, tax, excise, or license imposed by the State or federal government.

(b) Not in limitation of immediately preceding subsection 113.10.3(a), payment of the tax imposed by this section shall not relieve the person paying it from the payment of any other tax now or hereafter imposed by contract or ordinance or by this Code, including without limitation those imposed for any business or occupation carried on along with the restaurant or drinking place, unless otherwise provided therein. It is the intent of the Council that the occupation tax imposed by this section shall be cumulative unless otherwise expressly provided.

§ 113.10.4. – RETURN AND ADMINISTRATION ALLOWANCE.

(a) Each and every person engaged in a restaurant or drinking place within the City for any period of time on or after the Effective Date shall prepare and file with the City Administrator a return for each calendar month and at the same time pay to the City the tax herein imposed. The return shall be on and in such form and content and include such supporting data as may be prescribed by the City Administrator from time to time, and shall be verified and sworn to by an officer responsible for the restaurant or drinking place, and shall be filed with the City Administrator on or before the last day of the month immediately following receipt of any gross receipts included for purposes of calculating the tax. Returns and tax payments shall be filed and paid (i) hand delivery or by United States mail, properly addressed, postage prepaid and postmarked no later than the last day of the appropriate month, or (ii) by electronic filing and payment by Automated Clearing Housing or Credit Card no later than the last day of the appropriate month, and in accordance with such procedures as prescribed by the City Administrator from time to time.

(b) As reimbursement for any additional administrative costs and expenses connected with the tax, a taxpayer at the time of each tax payment may elect to deduct, withhold, and retain from such payment two percent (2%) of the amount that is otherwise due and payable to the City ("Administration Allowance"). Any payment that is made without reduction for the Administration Allowance shall be deemed an irrevocable election by the taxpayer to forego the Administration Allowance with respect to that payment.

§ 113.10.5. - EFFECTIVE DATE.

The occupation tax imposed by this section shall commence on the Effective Date and shall continue and remain in effect unless terminated by City ordinance. Provided, however, the tax shall be eligible for reconsideration every ten years as follows. The City Council shall vote on any motion of any City Council member at a Council meeting that is seconded directing the City Administrator to prepare a proposed Ordinance to terminate the tax. The motion must be made within the first ninety days of the fiscal year beginning immediately after the ten-year anniversary of such tax, or within the first ninety days of the fiscal year beginning immediately after any subsequent ten-year anniversary. If the motion is approved, the City Administrator shall prepare a proposed Ordinance for consideration of the City Council at a subsequent Council meeting held within an administratively practicable time. If a motion is not made, or if the motion or proposed Ordinance fails, the tax will continue in effect.

Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. Any conflicting provision of any previously enacted ordinance is hereby repealed, effective at midnight on the day before the Effective Date.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista hereby declare that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 5. Publication and Effective Date of Ordinance. This Ordinance shall be published in full and shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

SYNOPSIS

The third and final reading of an Appropriations Ordinance has been prepared to amend the FY19 & FY20 Biennial Budget adopted on September 4, 2018 to include changes to the FY20 municipal budget.

FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed amended budget for FY20 is \$58,802,985 in all funds.

The FY20 budget change from the second reading to the final reading is an increase of \$1,022,137 and is the result of an update to the FY20 interlocal agreement for fire & EMS services (\$109,537) and project carryovers associated with capital improvement project construction schedules updates (\$912,600).

While the Papillion Fire budget went up by slightly over \$1.0 million, La Vista's portion of the increase decreased from 25% to 23.7% based on assessed valuation. The proposed budget increase includes the addition of a fire truck and crew at Fire Station #1 (107th & Chandler Road) which will help serve La Vista areas, in addition to the rescue squad service already provided.

The remaining changes totaling \$912,600 are related to the August update of FY19 year-end estimates for construction projects. As the current fiscal year nears completion, we are better able to estimate current expenditures and the additional funds that are necessary to be carried over into the following year. Specifically: 84th Street Overlay — \$600,000; City Centre Intersection — \$150,000; and the City Park Interface Improvements — \$150,000.

The total final property tax request for FY20 is \$9,082,799 and requires a property tax levy of \$0.55 per \$100 dollars of assessed valuation. The owner of a home valued at \$150,000 will pay \$825 in property taxes, or \$68.75 per month. The proposed budget has no increase in the property tax rate.

BACKGROUND

The City Council approved the first reading of the Appropriations Ordinance at their August 5, 2017 meeting and held a public hearing and approved the second reading of at their August 20, 2019 meeting.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 1323 AND THE BIEENNIAL BUDGET APPROPRIATING THE SUMS OF MONEY DEEMED NECESSARY TO DEFRAY ALL OF THE NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD BEGINNING ON OCTOBER 1, 2018 AND ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2019; AND FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2019 AND ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2020, AND SPECIFICALLY TO AMEND AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED FOR THE SECOND YEAR OF SUCH BIEENNIAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2019 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2020, SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE AND THE AMOUNT TO BE APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OBJECT OR PURPOSE; SPECIFYING THE AMOUNT TO BE RAISED BY TAX LEVY; PROVIDING FOR THE FILING AND CERTIFICATION OF THE BUDGET AND TAX LEVY HEREIN SENT TO THE STATE AUDITOR AND COUNTY CLERK OF SARPY COUNTY; TO REPEAL INCONSISTENT OR CONFLICTING ORDINANCES OR RESOLUTIONS AS ORIGINALLY ENACTED; AND PRESCRIBING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA.

Section 1. That (i) the Mayor and City Council find and determine that there are circumstances which could not reasonably have been anticipated at the time the budget for the biennial period was adopted, and proposed revisions to the previously adopted budget statement have been presented and are hereby ratified and affirmed, and (ii) after publication of notice and conducting a public hearing in accordance with applicable requirements, the Mayor and City Council desire to approve the proposed revised budget.

Section 2. That Section 1 of Ordinance No.1323 is hereby amended to revise amounts of the current biennial budget specified for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2019 and ending September 30, 2020 as follows:

"Section 1. That after complying with all procedures required by law, the budget presented and set forth in the budget statements, as amended and on file with the City Clerk, is hereby approved as The Annual Appropriation Bill for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2018, through September 30, 2019 and the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2019, through September 30, 2020, including summaries and supporting documentation. All sums of money contained in the revised budget statement are hereby appropriated for the necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of La Vista. The following amounts appropriated shall be raised primarily as follows. A copy of the budget document, as amended, shall be forwarded as provided by law to the Auditor of Public Accounts, State Capital, Lincoln, Nebraska, and to the County Clerk of Sarpy County, Nebraska for use by the levying authority.

SYNOPSIS

An ordinance has been prepared to amend the Master Fee Ordinance.

FISCAL IMPACT

Various fees have been added or changed.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval.

BACKGROUND

An ordinance has been prepared to amend the Master Fee Ordinance to add/change the following fees:

1. Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Application Fees – After extensive review by the Community Development Department and review of several other cities' fees, a fee structure was developed to recover staff and legal costs for the review of TIF applications. Separate Implementation and Administrative fees cover staff and legal costs to move a TIF project through the approval and implementation process. To cover the costs of issuing the TIF-related bonds, the actual fees and cost incurred by the city from 3rd party counsel are forwarded on to the developer.
2. Watershed Fees – the fees are determined by Exhibit "G" of the Interlocal agreement for the Papillion Creek Watershed Partnership. The fee changes go into effect on July 1 of each year. The reference allows the fees to go into effect per the terms of the agreement. (Exhibit "G" is attached)
3. Parking Permit Fees - The fees for on-street and off-street parking have been adjusted to better reflect the current market rates. The analysis supporting this proposed change is attached. Given the uncertainty of the development schedule, a short-term parking revenue projection based on these fees would be speculative. While the proposed fee schedule likely will result in an operational subsidy for the Off Street Parking Fund, the exact extent is not known. Staff will continue to evaluate the rate structure and update City Council as more data is available.
4. Sewer Fees - The City Council approved the Sewer Rate Study completed by Burns & McDonnell at the May 21, 2019 City Council meeting. The study recommends a customer charge increase of 2% and

a flow charge increase of 6%, an overall 5% increase annually over the next five years, FY20 through FY24.

The rates recommended in the Master Fee Schedule are effective October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 for FY20 and are an overall 5% increase over current rates to achieve cost recovery and an adequate reserve. Rates will be evaluated annually through the rate study model and changes requested in the Master Fee Schedule.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO.1324, AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE AMOUNT OF CERTAIN FEES AND TAXES CHARGED BY THE CITY OF LA VISTA FOR VARIOUS SERVICES INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO BUILDING AND USE, ZONING, OCCUPATION, PUBLIC RECORDS, ALARMS, EMERGENCY SERVICES, RECREATION, LIBRARY, AND PET LICENSING; SEWER AND DRAINAGE SYSTEMS AND FACILITIES OF THE CITY FOR RESIDENTIAL USERS AND COMMERCIAL USERS (INCLUDING INDUSTRIAL USERS) OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA AND TO GRANDFATHER EXISTING STRUCTURES AND TO PROVIDE FOR TRACT PRECONNECTION PAYMENTS AND CREDITS; REGULATING THE MUNICIPAL SEWER DEPARTMENT AND RATES OF SEWER SERVICE CHARGES; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; AND TO PROVIDE THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. General Fee Schedule. The fees and taxes charged by the City of La Vista for various services, facilities, and occupations shall be, and the same hereby are, fixed in accordance with the following schedule, no modifier shall be used, and such fees and taxes charged shall be in accordance with such rules as the City Council may establish:

Section 2. Sewer Fee Schedule.

§3-103 Municipal Sewer Department; Rates.

- A. **Levy of Sewer Service Charges.** The following sewer service charges shall be levied against the user of premises, property or structures of every kind, nature and description, which has water service from any supply source and are located within the wastewater service area of the City of La Vista.
- B. **Computation of Sewer Service Charges.** For the months of December, January, February and March, the monthly charge for residential sewer services will be computed on the actual water used for these months. The monthly charge for residential sewer service in the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November will be computed on the average water usage of the four (4) preceding winter months of December, January, February and March or for such portion of said consumption, whichever is the lesser. At the option of the City of La Vista, water used from private wells shall be either metered or estimated for billing purposes.
- C. **Amount of Sewer Service Charges.** The total sewer service charge for each sewer service user will be the sum of three (3) charges: (1) customer charge, (2) flow charge, and (3) abnormal charge.
 - 1. The customer charge is as follows
 - a. For sewer service users classified as Residential, the same being sewer service to a single family dwelling, or a duplex, apartment, or other multi-family dwelling (e.g. apartments) wherein each dwelling unit has a separate water meter that is read and charged for water and sewer use by the Metropolitan Utilities District - \$11.9912.23 per month.
 - b. For sewer service users classified as Residential-Multi-Family, the same being sewer service to Multi-Family dwellings (e.g. apartments) wherein there is only a separate water meter to each building or complex that is read and charged for water and sewer use by the Metropolitan Utilities District - \$11.9913.11 per month ~~plus an amount equal to \$1.82 times the total number of dwelling units, less one, in the Multi-Family dwellings that comprise an apartment complex. The customer charge for Residential-Multi Family sewer service users will be billed by the City of La Vista in addition to the flow charge billing from the Metropolitan~~

~~Utilities District. A late charge of 14% will be applied for Multi-Family sewer use billings.~~

- c. For sewer service users classified as General Commercial: Customers who normally use less than 100,000 cubic feet of water per month and who are not Residential users or Residential-Multi-Family users - ~~\$12.85~~13.11 per month. For sewer service users in this category that require manual billing, add \$10.00 for a total of ~~\$22.85~~23.11. The manual billing of the customer charge will come from the City of La Vista instead of the Metropolitan Utilities District.
- 2. The flow charge for all sewer service users shall be ~~\$3.50~~3.71 per hundred cubic feet (ccf).
- 3. If users have abnormal strength sewage as determined by the terms of the Wastewater Service Agreement between the City of La Vista and the City of Omaha, then additional charges will be billed to the user at the applicable rates as determined by said Agreement.
- 4. If users other than those classified herein are connected to the wastewater collection system, the Customer Charges, the Flow Charges and Other Charges will be determined by the City Council in accordance with rules and regulations of the EPA and the Agreement between the City of La Vista and the City of Omaha.

Section 3. Sewer/Drainage Connection Fee Schedule. A fee shall be paid to the City Treasurer as set forth in this section for each structure or tract to be connected to the sewer system of the City. No connection permit or building permit shall be issued until the following connection fees have been paid.

The fee for commercial (including industrial) shall be computed on the number of acres within each platted lot or tract, irrespective of the number of structures to be constructed thereon.

The applicable fee shall be paid in respect to each lot or building site as a condition of City's issuance of any building or sewer connection permit.

- A. Changes in Use. If the use of a lot changes subsequent to payment of the fee, which different use would require payment of a fee greater than that payable in respect to the use for which the fee was originally paid, the difference in fee shall be paid to the City at time of such change in use.
- B. Existing Structures. Structures for which sewer connection and building permits have been issued, and all permit fees in respect thereto paid, prior to the effective date hereof shall be exempt from the fees herein imposed.
- C. Preconnection Payments. Where preconnection payment charges for a subdivision or portion thereof have been paid to City at time of subdivision of a tract pursuant to agreement between the City and the developer and the sanitary and improvement district, if any, financing improvements of the subdivision, the preconnection payment so made shall be credited by City to the sewer/drainage fees payable at time of connection of the individual properties to the sewer/drainage systems of the City.

D. Sewer Tap and Inspection and Sewer Service Fees. The fees imposed by Section 3 hereof are in addition to and not in lieu of (1) sewer tap and inspection fees payable pursuant to Section 3-122 of the La Vista Municipal Code and listed herein and (2) sewer service charges imposed by Section 2 hereof.

Section 4. Sewer Inspection Charges Established for Installation. Inspection charges for nonresidential property sewer installation shall be:

Section 6. Repeal of Ordinance No.1324. Ordinance No. 1324 as originally approved on December 5, 2017 and all ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. Severability Clause. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista hereby declare that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law; provided, however, that:

(1) Pawnbroker occupation taxes of Section 1 shall be effective April 1, 2003. Pawnbroker occupations taxes shall be payable on a monthly basis no later than the last day of the calendar month immediately following the month in which the subject pawnbroker transactions occur. For example, the occupation tax on pawnbroker transactions for the month of April 2003 shall be due and payable on or before May 31, 2003.

(2) Pawnbroker permit fees shall be effective January 1, 2004. Annual pawnbroker permit fees shall be due and payable annually on or before January 1. Initial pawnbroker permit fees shall be due and payable on or before the date that the pawnbroker license is issued. Issuance of renewal of pawnbroker permits shall be subject to payment of applicable permit fees.

(3) Rental Inspection Program License fees shall be effective January 1, 2011

(4) The remaining provisions of this Ordinance other than those specified in Sections 8(1), 8(2) and 8(3) shall take effect upon publication.

SYNOPSIS

A public hearing has been scheduled and a resolution has been prepared to establish the property tax request for FY20.

FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed tax levy would be \$0.55 cents per \$100 of valuation. Specifically:

General Fund — \$0.49
 Bond Fund — \$0.06

RECOMMENDATION

Approval.

BACKGROUND

At the City Council budget workshops on July 16, 2019, Council directed staff to prepare the notice of budget statement based upon a municipal levy of \$0.55 cents per \$100 of valuation. A public hearing on the proposed budget was held August 5, 2019.

The County Assessor has notified the City that the 2019 Taxable Valuation in La Vista is \$1,651,417,826 with \$15,469,486 of that amount attributable to new growth.

The Nebraska Legislature recently passed legislation requiring four statements regarding the percentage of change from the prior year's budget be included in the resolution. The numbers included in the resolution come from the state budget form which now automatically includes transfers from one fund to another (see Exhibit A attached). Consequently, this form essentially "counts" a transfer of funds as revenue, even though no additional money is being received. Likewise, due to the configuration of the state form, expenses appear to be less than actual due to construction project schedules spanning multiple years but initially being budgeted in one year. The City has a number of large projects underway resulting in multiple transfers between funds that can vary greatly from year to year depending on the construction schedules.

The General Fund disbursement line item shown on the attached Exhibit 'A' represents operation expenditures of the City and indicates an 8% increase in FY20 over FY19, which is a correct representation despite the fact that this state form shows a bottom line that decreases, again because we are forced to include transfers between other funds in the total.

The amount of revenue generated from property tax shows a 7% increase from FY19 to FY20 due to an increase in property valuations, not an increase in the City's tax levy.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA ESTABLISHING THE PROPERTY TAX REQUEST FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 20.

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request at a different amount; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of La Vista that the property tax request for fiscal year 20 be a different amount than the property tax request for the prior year; and

WHEREAS, the FY20 operating budget is a 12% decrease from FY19; and

WHEREAS, the FY20 property tax request is a 7% increase from FY19; and

WHEREAS, the FY20 valuation is a 7% increase from FY19; and

WHEREAS, the FY20 tax rate is a 0% change from FY19,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska, by a majority vote, hereby resolve that:

The FY20 property tax requests be set at \$9,082,799.00 which would require a mill levy of \$0.55.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City council of the City of La Vista Nebraska that the property tax to be distributed as follows:

General Fund - \$8,091,948.00 (\$0.49 mill levy)

Bond Fund - \$990,851.00 (\$0.06 mill levy)

In May of 2019 Graham Construction relocated the sanitary sewer pipe that ran through the park further to the north to avoid the building footprint of City Centre. At that time, we asked Blademasters to complete that work under the seeding line item for their current contract. An adjustment needs to be made to this line item to capture this additional work.



A resolution has been prepared to authorize a lease agreement with Chrysler Capital (representing Baxter Auto Group) in an amount not to exceed \$17,500.

BACKGROUND

The Police Department has an officer assigned to the FBI Greater Omaha Safe Streets Task Force. Funding from the FBI includes resources to provide a vehicle for the Task Force officer. The current lease is expiring, and a new lease is needed. The LVPD selected Baxter Auto Group because they have a closed-end (walkaway) lease. The LVPD currently has a lease for another narcotics vehicle from Baxter that was approved by the City Council in April 2019. This lease would be for 36 months (September 2019—September 2022). Safe Streets Task Force monies fund the entire lease.

SYNOPSIS

A resolution has been prepared to approve the plans and specifications and authorize the execution of contracts and construction of splash park improvements in SID 237 (Cimarron Woods).

FISCAL IMPACT

SID 237 proposes to use construction fund financing which will become bonded debt of the SID. The low bid is \$380,185.50. There are engineering, legal and financing fees in addition to this which will result in a total project cost of \$500,000.00.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval of the plans and specifications prepared by E&A Consulting Group subject to providing acceptable revisions to the plans per the City Engineer's request.

Approval of SID 237 entering into a contract with Dostals Construction Co. Inc. in the amount of \$380,185.50.

BACKGROUND

Representatives from SID 237 (Cimarron Woods) approached the City regarding the need for splash park improvements as the subdivision agreement requires City approval of plans and expenditures associated with the repair or reconstruction of public improvements.

E & A Consulting Group, Inc. received bids for the project on July 24, 2019 and have identified Dostals Construction Co. Inc. as the low compliant bidder and recommend awarding a construction contract in an amount not to exceed \$380,185.50.

The Subdivision Agreement provides that an administrative fee in the amount of 2% to be collected on the construction cost of public improvements. Since this project is primarily a reconstruction of an existing public improvement on which a fee was previously collected and since no outside consultant review is required, waiving the administrative fee for this project is recommended.
