LA VISTA FALLS GOLF COURSE

We had rain on 8 days in August with several of those days bringing very heavy rains and leaving conditions very wet for Golf and FootGolf.

In August 2015, we averaged 35 FootGolf rounds on the 12 days it was available to be played. In August 2014, we averaged 18 Golf rounds during those same days and times we offered Golf.

During the months of August we had FootGolf outings with, 2 Bellevue Soccer Club teams (35), 2 Elite Academy soccer teams (39), Omaha FC (24), Papio Soccer Club (16) and Bakers Pharmacy Dept (13). The outing we had scheduled with the Midland University Girls soccer team (35) was rained out.

Council member Jim Fredericks approached me about scheduling a FootGolf fund raiser for Big Brothers/Big Sisters. Jim and I met with 2 members of the Sigma Phi Epsilon Philanthropy and have set a date of Sept 26. Goal is to get 200 members to play FootGolf.

I also met with James Bilodeau who is the GM of the Omaha Pioneers Soccer Association, which is putting together men's and women's amateur soccer teams with the intent to develop these players to get to the next level. Their goal is to field an adult amateur men's and women's team to compete for the USASA Amateur Championships in June/July 2016. A FootGolf fund raiser would help raise funds for their organization as well as sending teams to this championship.

Shoreline golf course in Carter Lake, IA is the most recent course in the area to offer FootGolf, in addition to us, Warren Swigert and Papio Greens.
