LA VISTA FALLS GOLF COURSE

For the first time in 5 years we didn't have any rounds in January. The golf course remained snow covered throughout the entire month.

On January 16th, the clubhouse was rented out for a 40th birthday party which brought in over \$300 worth of revenue.

Most of January was spent on contacting our external golf leagues to determine that they were returning for the 2016 season. All of them are returning. For our internal leagues, league start and end dates, fees, registration forms and league guidelines were determined and will be emailed to last year's teams in February.

I'm also working on business, school, soccer club, bar and tavern mailing lists to send out flyers and coupons and offer our course for golf and footgolf leagues, outings, fundraisers and events for upcoming season.

Golf vendors have been contacted and orders have been placed to stock golf balls, golf hats and other golf supplies.

Marketing plans to advertise golf and footgolf on social media such as Groupon, Daily Deal, the city website, Facebook, the Omaha World Herald, etc. are being discussed and will begin in late February or early March and throughout the season.
