**SYNOPSIS**

A resolution has been prepared authorizing the Mayor to sign Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement with Upstream Weeds (Chris Madden-Principal) for Storm Water Consultant Services, 2016 Public Education & Outreach in an amount not to exceed \$20,000.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

The funding for these services will come from the NDEQ Annual Storm Water Management Plan Grant. The agreement has a not-to-exceed total cost of \$40,000 with this being split \$20,000 to La Vista and \$20,000 to Papillion. The proposed amendment does not change the total cost or allocations.

**RECOMMENDATION**

Approval subject to the City of Papillion also approving of this Agreement.

**BACKGROUND**

At the November 17, 2015 City Council meeting an agreement with Upstream Weeds was approved for providing public education and outreach services for 2016. In order to reach a broader audience, provide a wider variety of informative events and to reduce the costs of the consultant services, the City partnered with the City of Papillion in this agreement. Public education and outreach efforts are an ongoing element of the Thompson Creek Watershed Management Plan in addition to the City's NPDES MS4 permit requirements. During this year, Upstream Weeds has encountered problems and opportunities with arranging some of the events initially envisioned. As a result a revision to the schedule and type of events has been developed. Discussions have been held with representatives of the City of Papillion Public Works Department and they are agreeable to the proposed revisions.

These services are needed as part of the Thompson Creek Channel Restoration project as well as NPDES MS4 storm water management requirements. During this year, Upstream Weeds has encountered problems and opportunities arranging some of the events initially envisioned. Therefore, an alternate list of events has been developed that responds to citizen interests and willingness of participants. The City is partnering with the City of Papillion in this agreement. Each City remains responsible for 50 percent of the consultant services.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT FOR ADDITIONAL STORMWATER CONSULTANT SERVICES WITH UPSTREAM WEEDS, OMAHA, NEBRASKA, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$20,000.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista Nebraska have determined an alternate list of events has been developed that responds to citizen interests and willingness of participants is necessary; and

WHEREAS, funding for these services will come from the NDEQ Annual Storm Water Management Plan Grant; and

WHEREAS, Subsection (C) (9) of Section 31.23 of the La Vista Municipal Code requires that the City Administrator secure Council approval prior to authorizing any expenditure over \$5,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska, do hereby approve an amendment to the agreement and authorize the Mayor to execute said agreement for additional storm water consultant services with Upstream Weeds., Omaha Nebraska in an amount not to exceed \$20,000.
