Special Events/Programs

Preschool Playtime met 9 times in August and had 174 preschoolers and 134 adults with an average of 19 preschoolers and 15 adult attend each session.

Preschool Play Time Craft day had 32 preschoolers and 24 parents create colorful turtles.

The August “**Pick-a-Park Storytime**” had 11 people attend our preschool story-time at Camenzind Park.

The last **Outdoor Concert and Movie Night** of the season was held on August 12th the Grease Band performed hits from the 50’s and 60’s and the movie “Pan” was shown to a crowd of over 350 people.

Our first **Family Net Night** was held on August 17th from 5:30-8:30 p.m. 16 people attended, and played Pickle-Ball, Chair Volleyball and Walleyball.

A **Jedi Knight Training Course** was held on Saturday August 27th from 10:30 a.m. to noon. It was a great family event with over 165 people attending. The Jedi Knights in training ran through our obstacle course, trained with light sabers, practiced their sharp shooting at the Blaster and Sonic Pistol range, practice their flight skill with Star Fighters and had the opportunity to do five different crafts, including making their own Yoda ears or Princess Leia hair buns!

Throughout the month, for a small donation, Seniors are able to enjoy a wonderful lunch catered by Valley Food Services on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. They also play Bingo on Mondays and Fridays, Chair Volleyball on Wednesdays and Fridays, participate in Tai Chi on Tuesdays (new day!) and Thursdays, and play Pinochle on the first and last Wednesdays of the month.
